








Athletics





This year we had a very successful season as we won 7 out of 9 games, despite heavy injuries to such stalwart players as Jim Berhendt, Dave Myers, Paul Dodge, Jim Krause and Fred Richmond. Here is a rundown on the accomplishments of the senior boys on the team this year.

This year's team was quarterbacked by Bob Etheridge, who did a bangup job of calling plays and leading the team. From his all important position this year Bob gained 150 yards in 28 attempts for a glittering 5.4 yards per carry average. This was good enough for four touchdowns and a total of 24 points. In addition to his field generalship he backed up the line on defense, and came through with the spot passes when the situation called for it.

Fred Richmond, who had proven time and again that he will give it all he's got, came through with 303 yards in only 41 carries, to lead the team with a 7.4 yards average per carry despite injuries which undoubtedly slowed down the hard driving back. He also scored four touchdowns and four all important extra points, for a total of 28 points.

Dave Myers was a true utility man, who was injured before he had a chance to shine. He would have been a good offensive back and a big help at the defensive end position.



Chuck Mahoney, another senior, is typical of the spirit of the entire team. He gave it all he had on every play of every game. Besides being a speedy halfback on offense he was utilized as a defensive halfback to break up long enemy aerials; he also proved that he could come up fast on the running game by stopping many a runner in the open field.


Paul Dodge was a real good end with a sure pair of hands. In pre-season practices and the early games he shone bright at his offensive end position, but was injured before he had a chance to get started. But he still was at all the games and never lost his spirit.

Nick Maricic was one of the top linemen on the team. Nick was one of the finest offensive as well as defensive linemen. He could be depended upon to give the backs that extra running room. With all of his achievements he was hampered by numerous injuries throughout the year.

Tom Forrest—CO-CAPTAIN—Tom was an alert team leader. He played both a defensive end and defensive halfback, as well as offensive center at times, which shows his versatility. He saved many a touchdown when he was the only man left between the opponents and our goal. The respect that his teammates had for him was shown in his election as co-captain.

Don Relyea — CO-CAPTAIN — Springfield's Mr. Football scored 86 points on 14 touchdowns and two extra points to lead the city as well as the team in scoring. Among his many achievements, he gained 777 yards in 117 carries for a 6.6 yard average. Also he gained 115 yards passing and did most of the punting for a 38.9 yard average. From his linebacker spot, Don sparked the team on defense as well as on offense. He led the team in tackles and became the first all-city choice from Springfield.





