





The recent purchase of an eleven acre tract of land by the School Board for a future elementary school to be located in southwest Springfield marks another step in the development and expansion of the Springfield Public School System. Pictorially, that expansion is shown on these pages.

At present these facilities are used by over 1100 students, taught by 52 teachers, in 43 regular classrooms plus special-area rooms such as science laboratories, homemaking area, arts and crafts, band and music rooms, two libraries, and two cafeterias, three gymnasiums, wood and metal shops.

Her majesty Beverly was crowned during halftime by last year's queen, Miss Sharon Zimmerman.








The Queen and Court reigned at the Homecoming Dance held the night after the game. This dance ended a very successful homecoming week.






