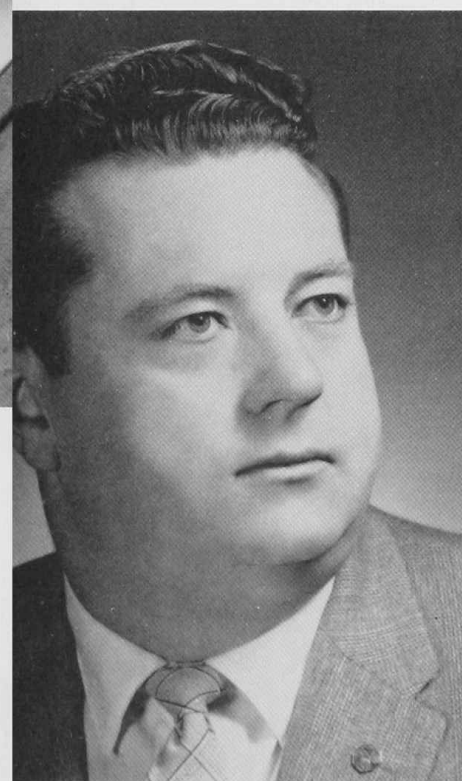

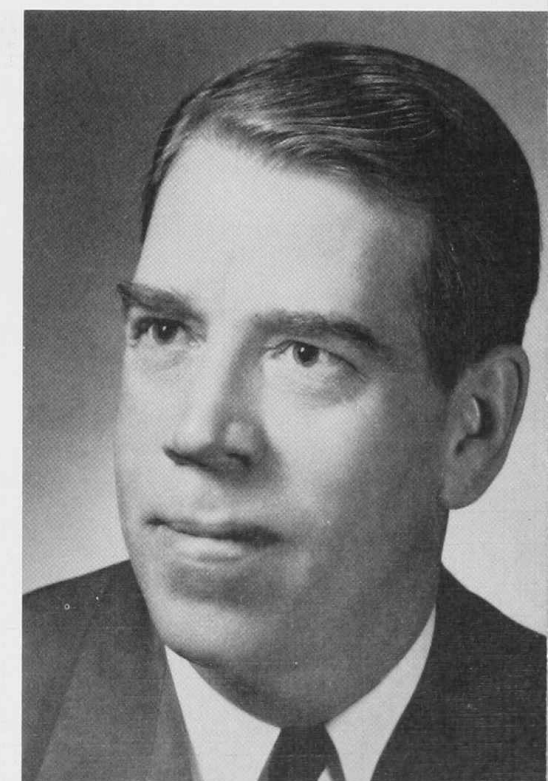

Mr. Robert B. Sellers, new Superintendent of Springfield Schools, greeted students and faculty in September.

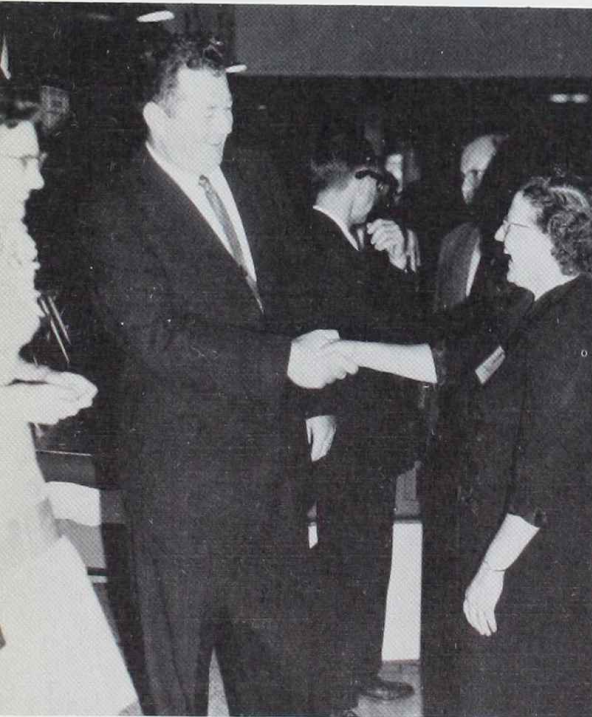

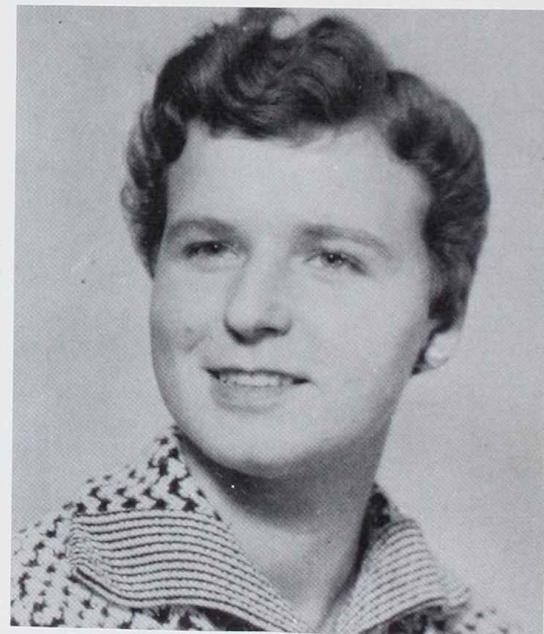

### CURRICULUM GROWS . . .

The high school courses of study reflect the new courses offered students this year increasing enrollments.

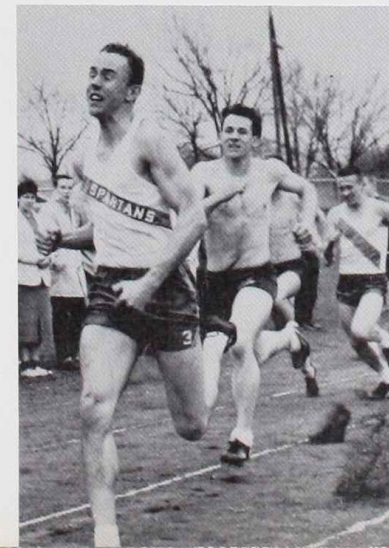
### ATHLETICS . . .

This is an excellent example of community and school cooperation. While the club house is small and in need of further improvements, it does afford, at present, facilities for the serving of food and general storage.

One of the nicest school parties this year was the "Club Hoakii-Lau" dance given by the Art Club. Colorful Hawaiian songs and dances were presented during the intermission. Students who attended will long remember February 21.

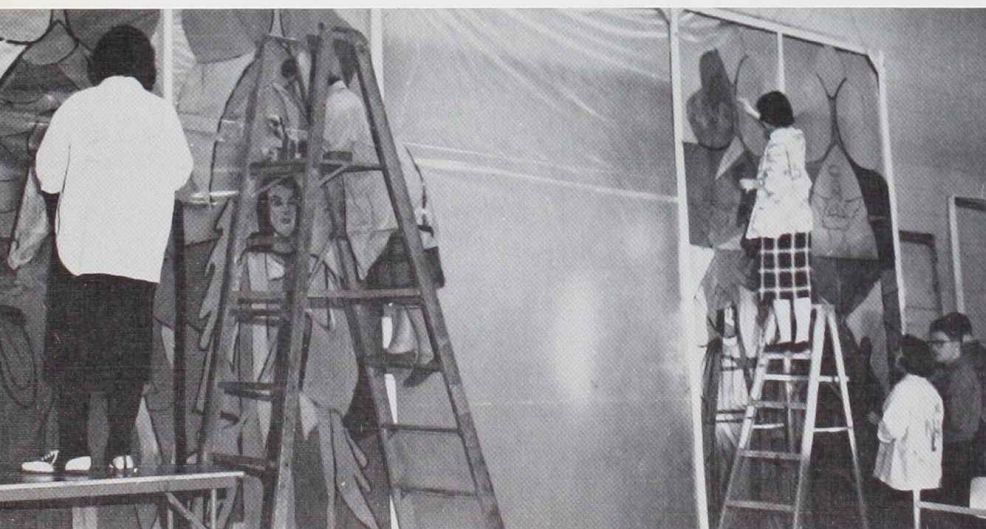
# Christmas Program
