

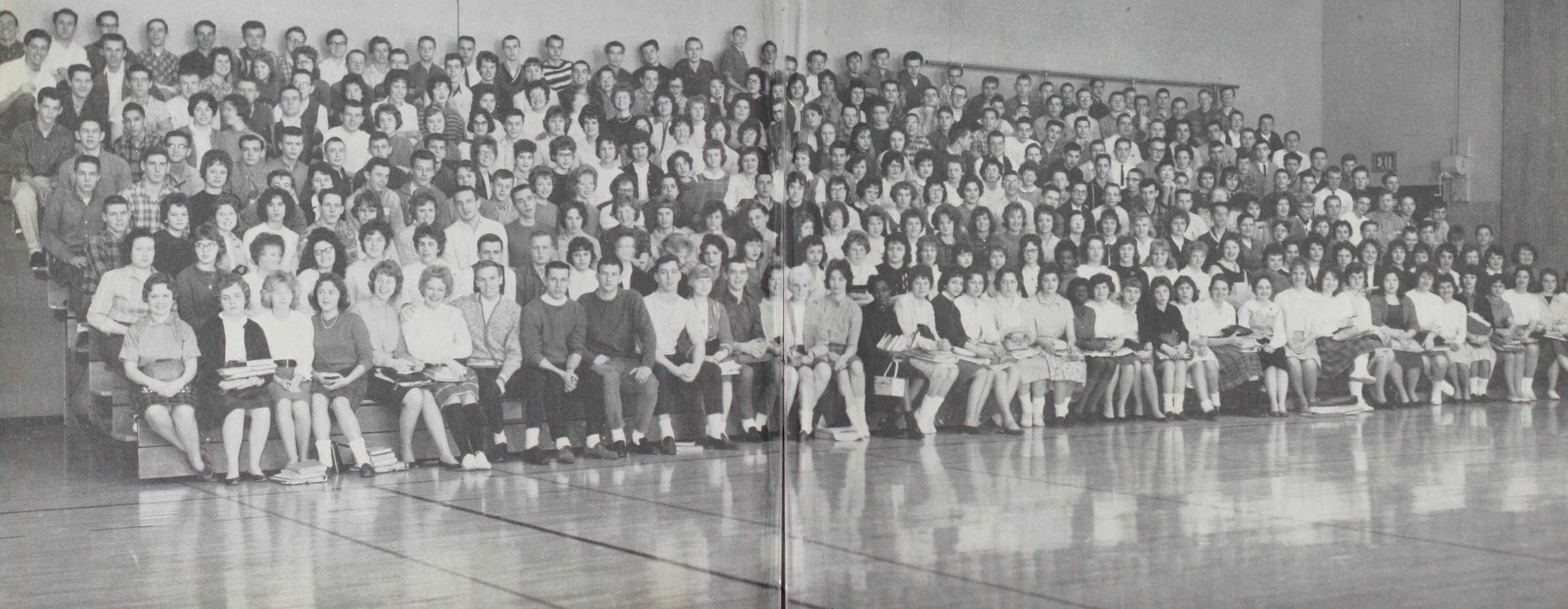

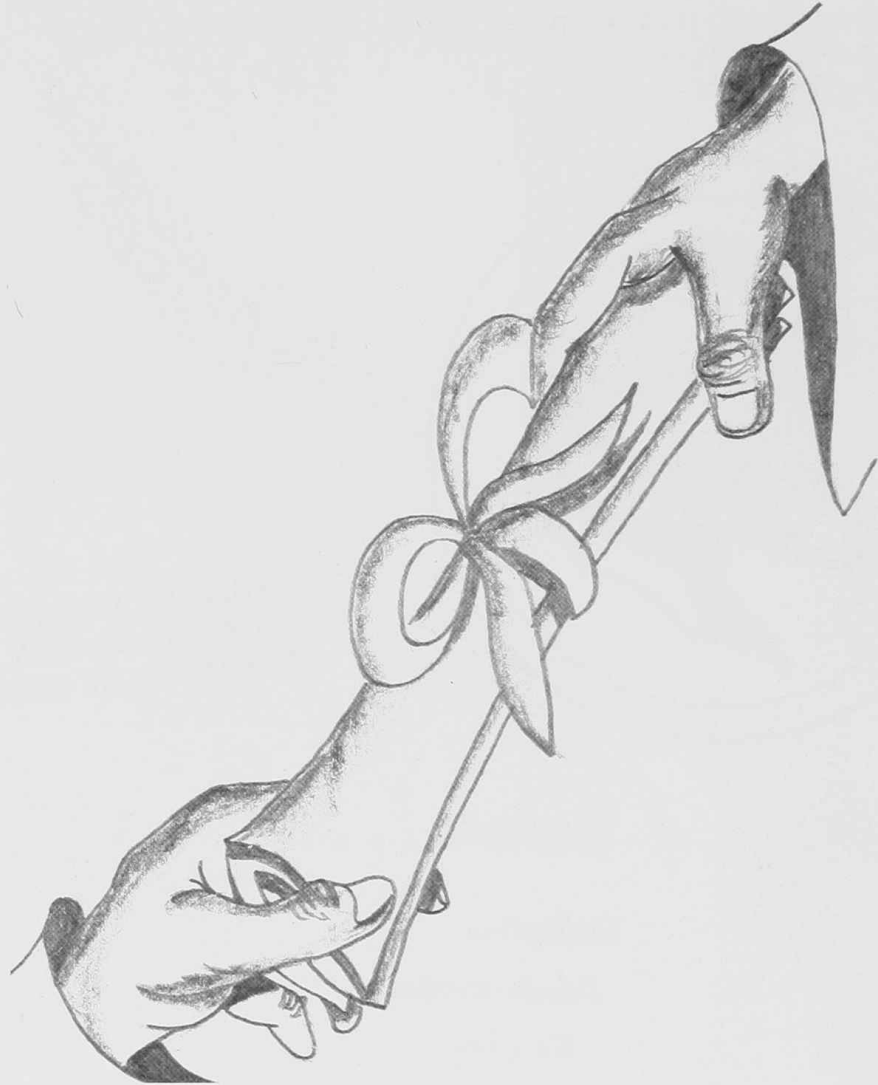

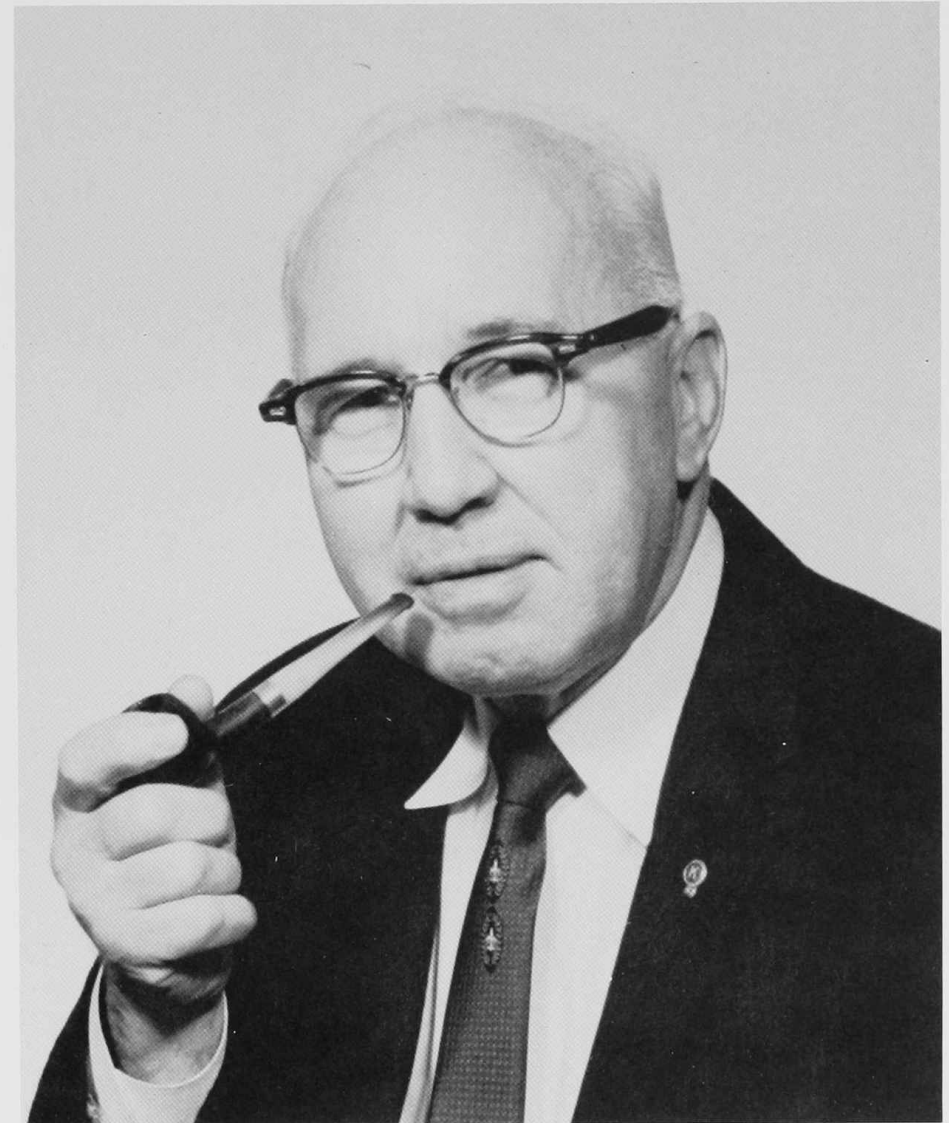
FOREWORD

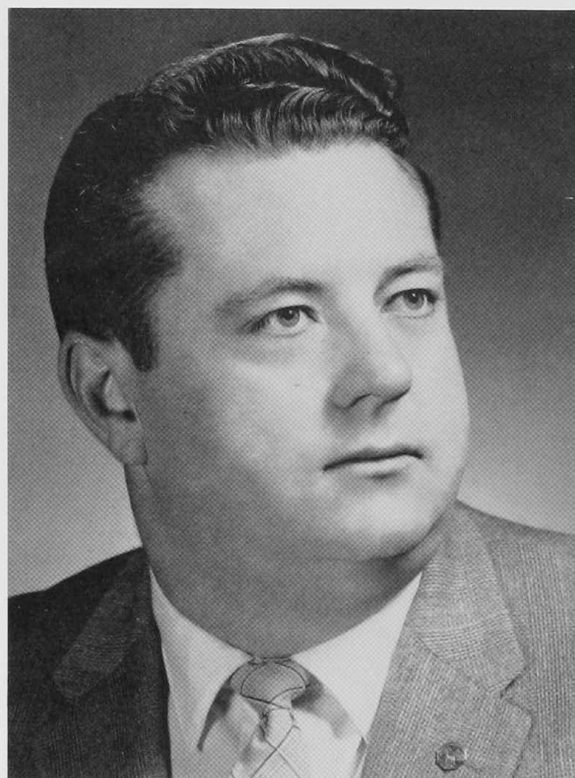

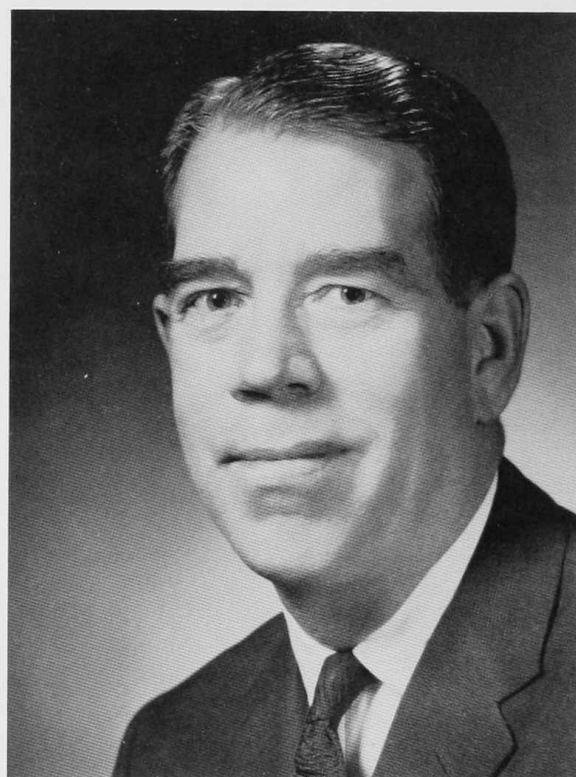


ADMINISTRATION

Custodians

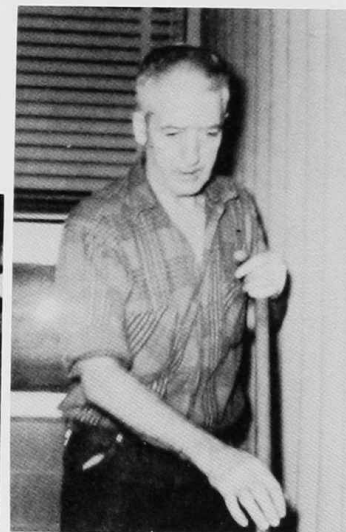
