


Business Studies, Training From Mith Demands

A business math class waits for Mr. Isaacson (top left) to erase before continuing. He is the newest member of the department, coming to us this year from nearby Pennfield.






Math Department

Mr. Ryor also coaches tennis, and Mr. Christensen is active as a student council advisor.






Science Department

The interest of girls for drawing is growing. Mr. Holcomb, shop and mechanical drawing instructor, looks at the "feminine touch" this student is putting on her work.




Physical Education Department




