Mrs. Swinehart is always willing to aid students in locating and using materials. She initiated the faculty book-selection policy and procedure this year.





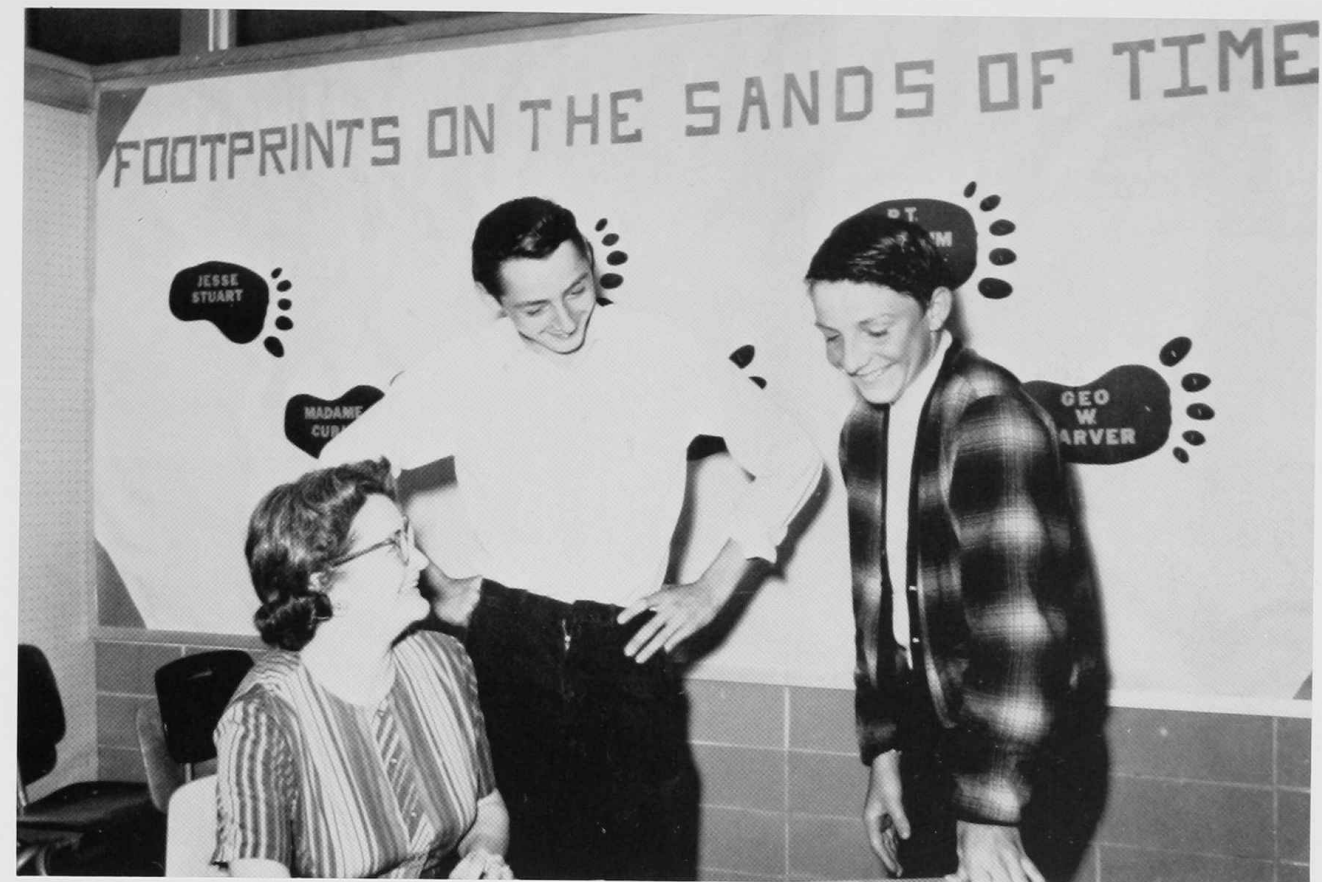
English Department

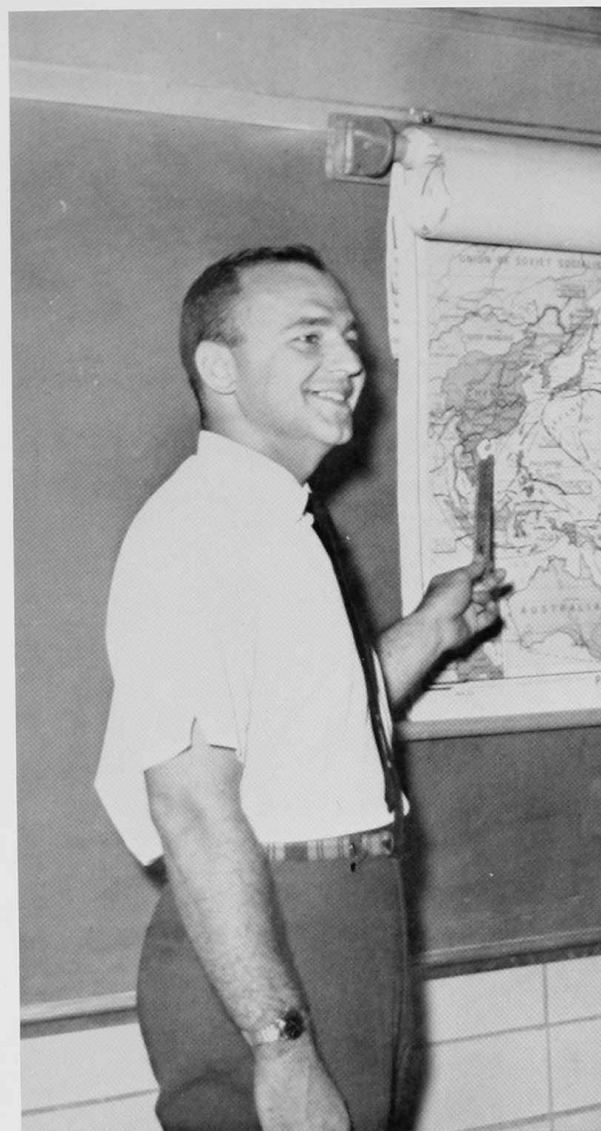

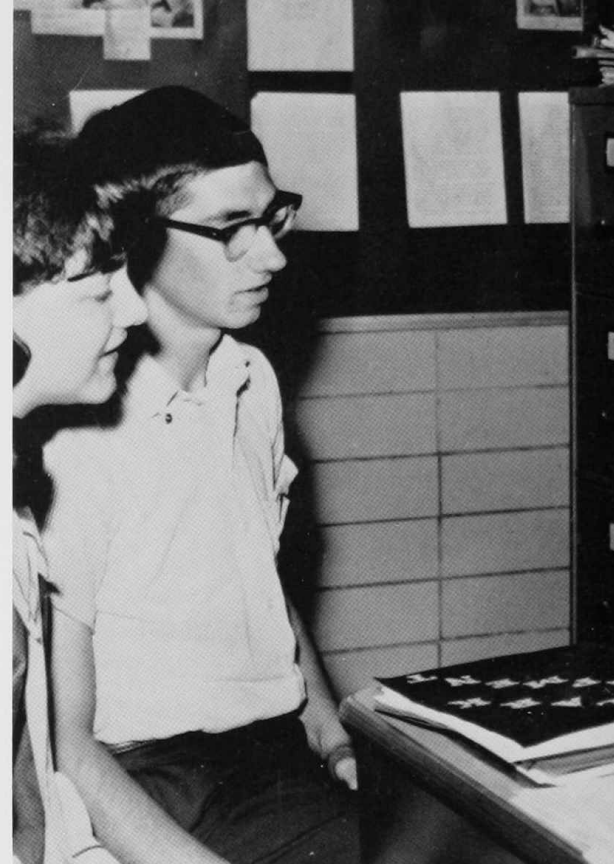
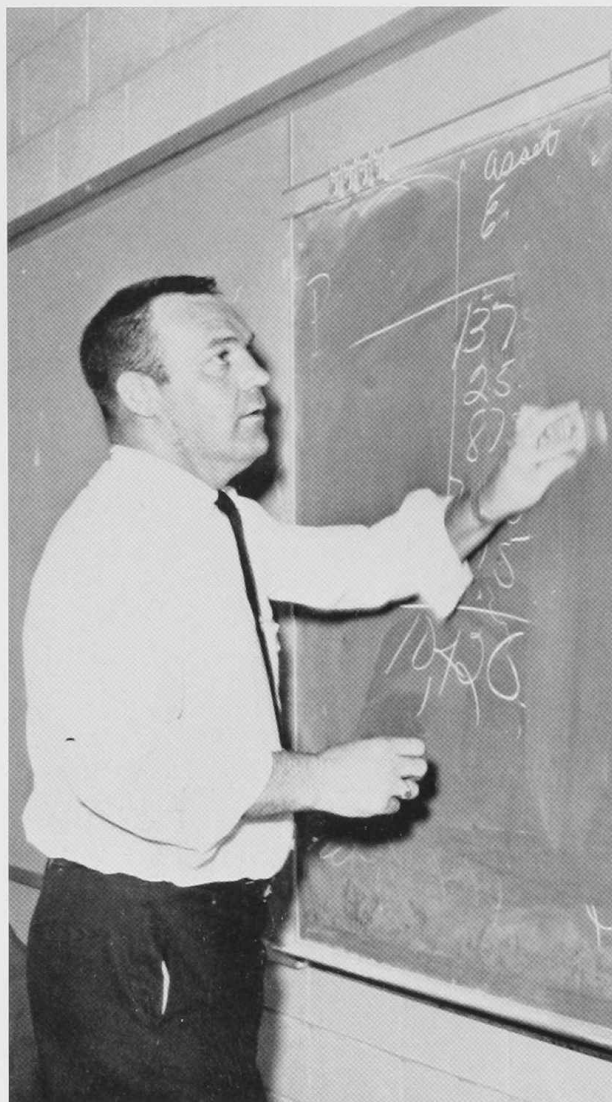

Business Studies, Training Grow With Demands

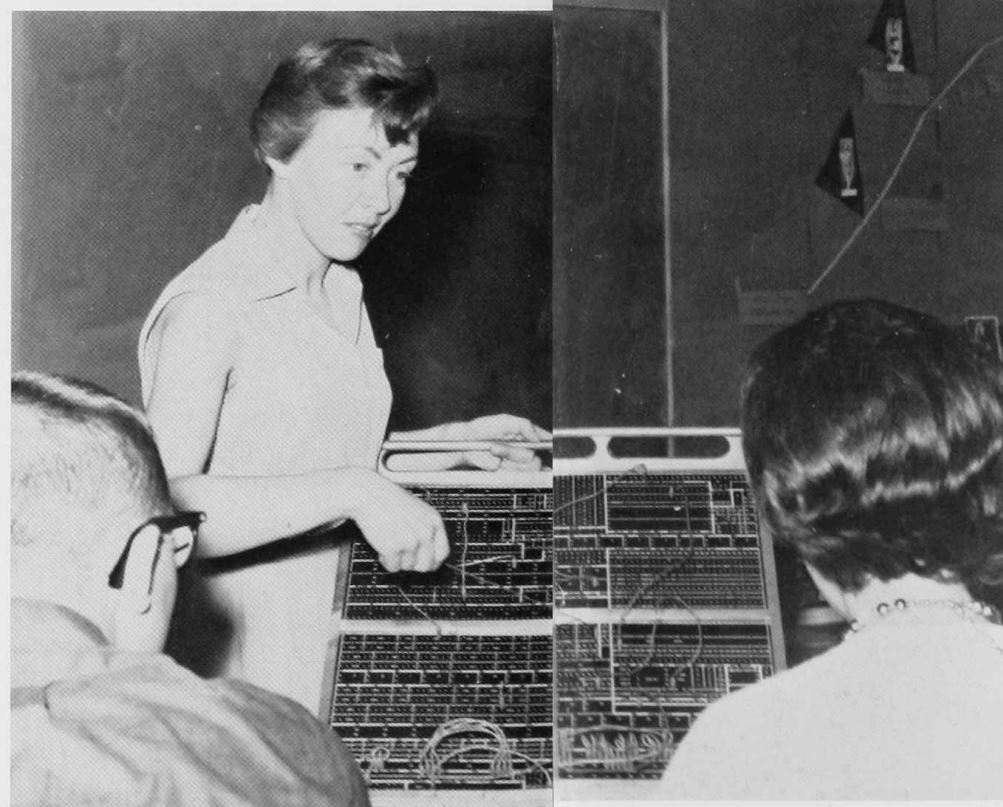

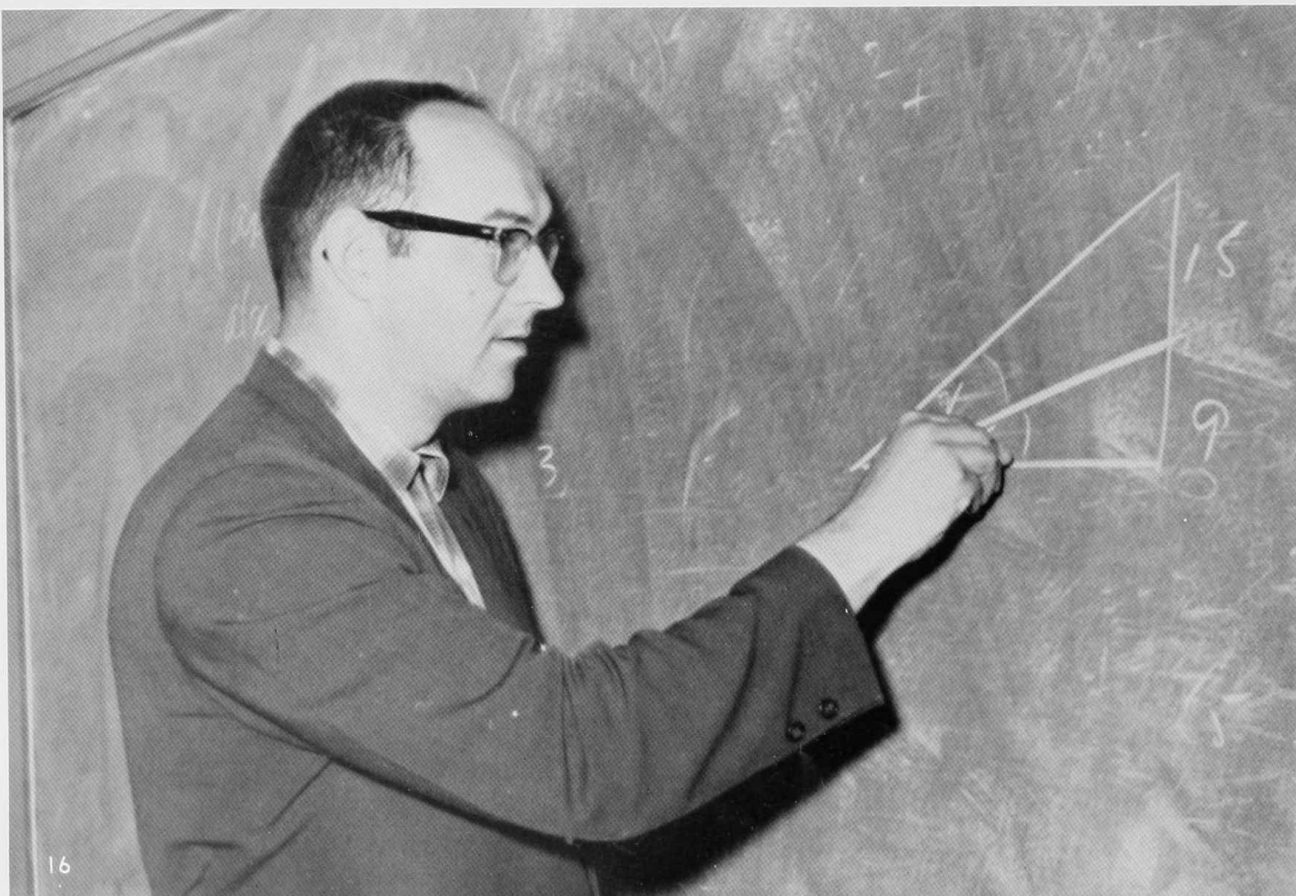

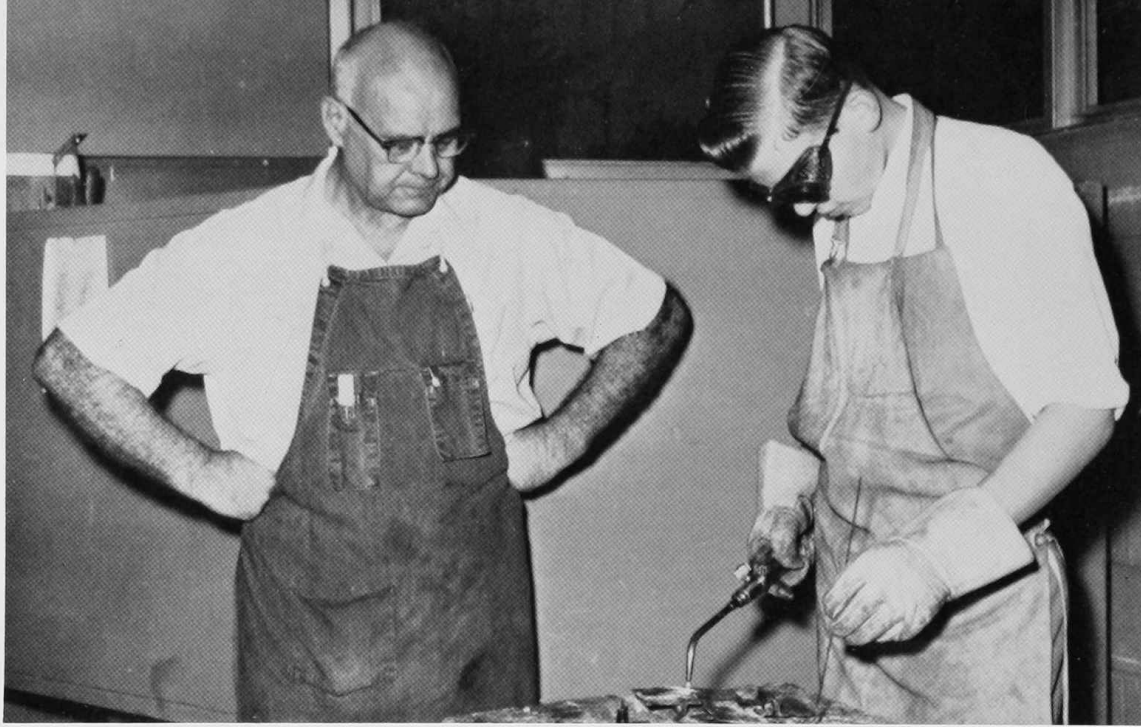
Science Department

The interest of girls for drawing is growing. Mr. Holcomb, shop and mechanical drawing instructor, looks at the "feminine touch" this student is putting on her work.

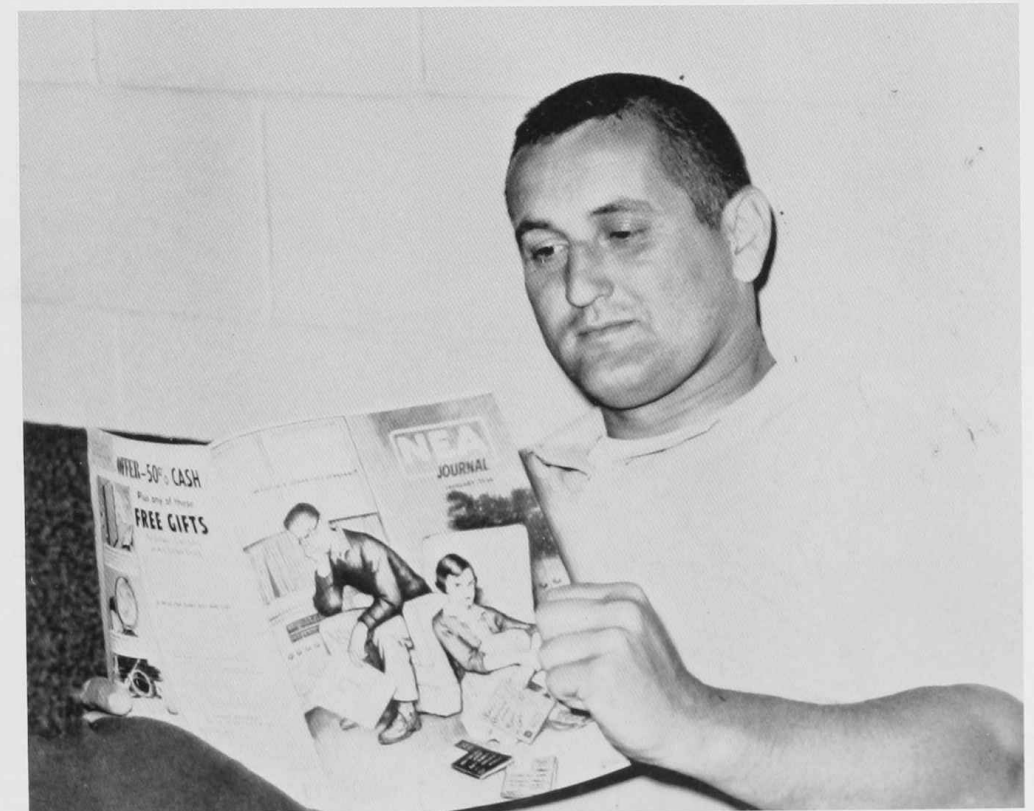
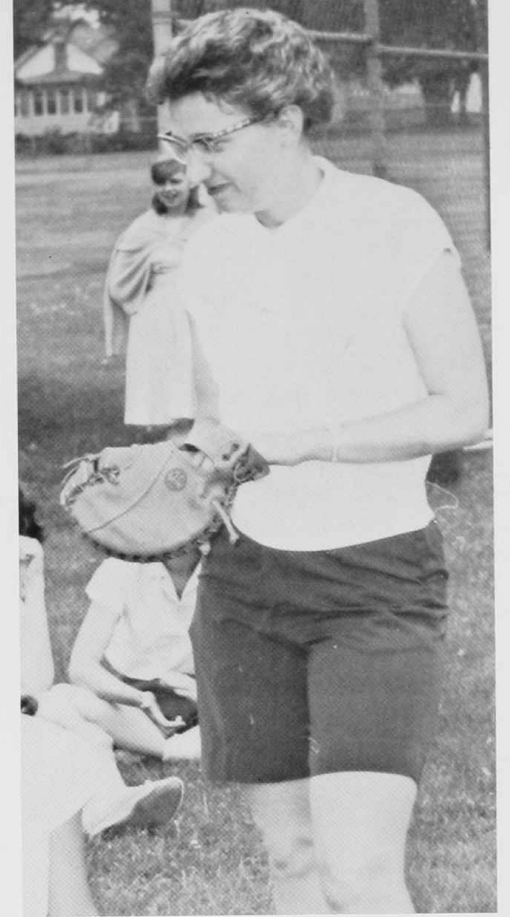


Physical Education Department

Mr. Gustafson became the new band director this year.

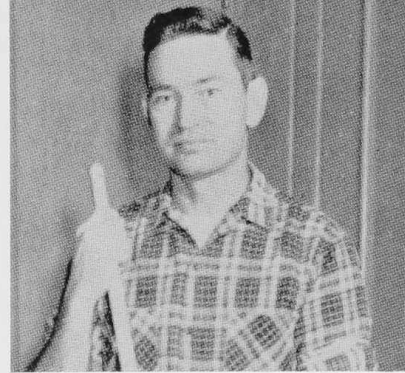

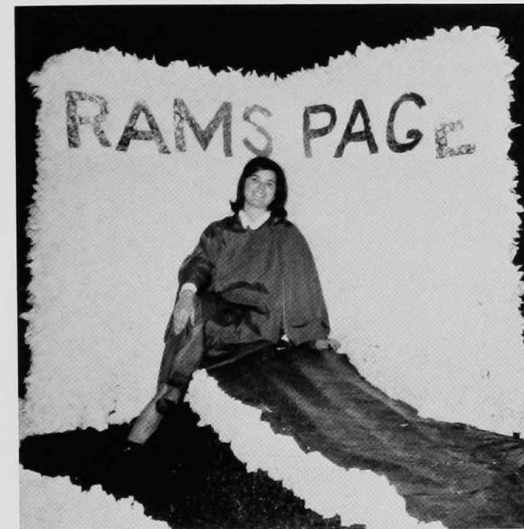




Inez Kreeftenberg

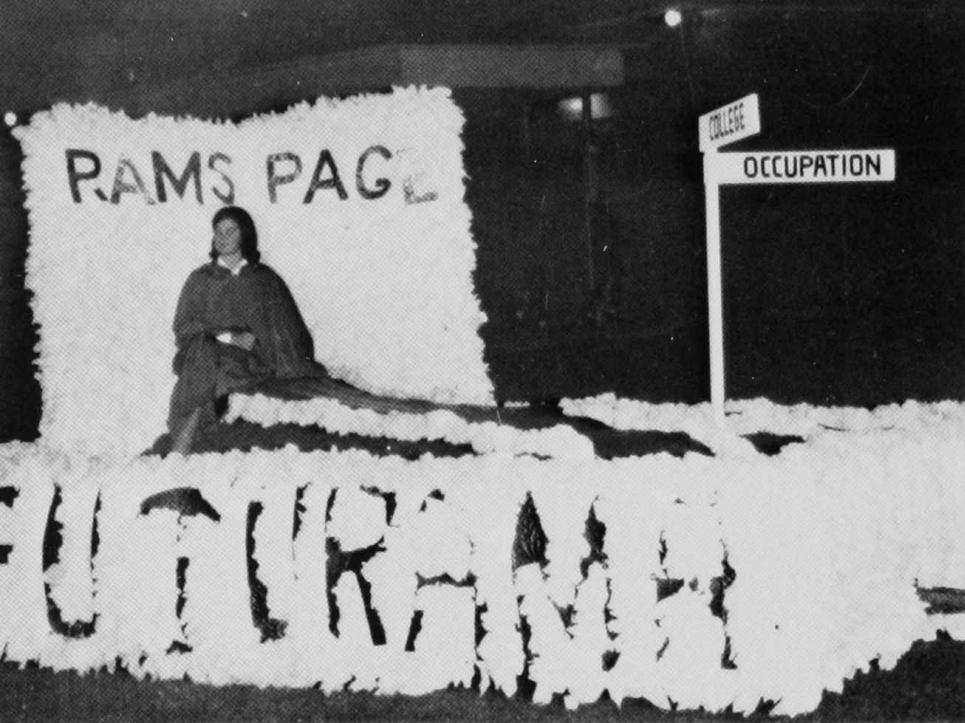

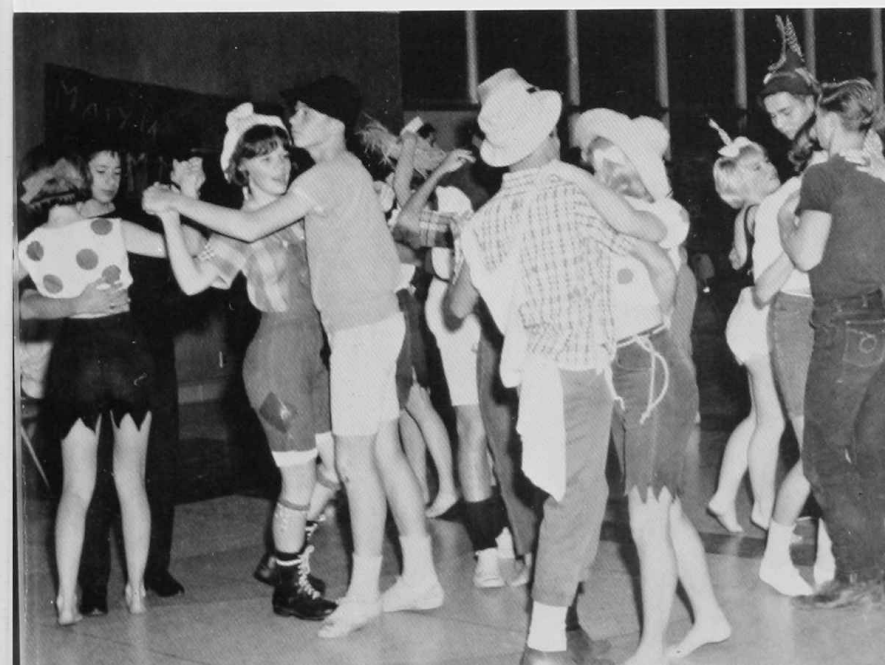

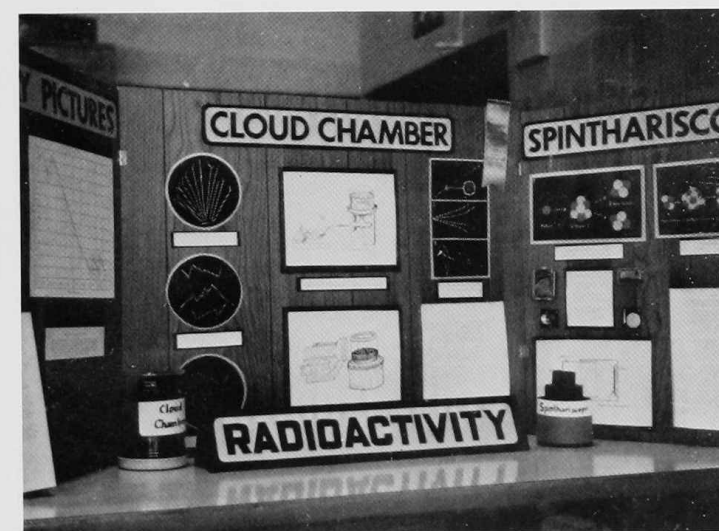

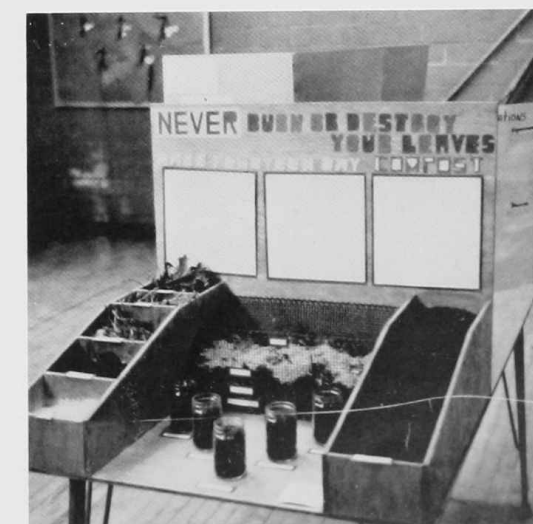
Inez, our own exchange student, played hostess for our third annual Foreign Exchange Day. Each visiting student gave a speech about his or her country and customs.

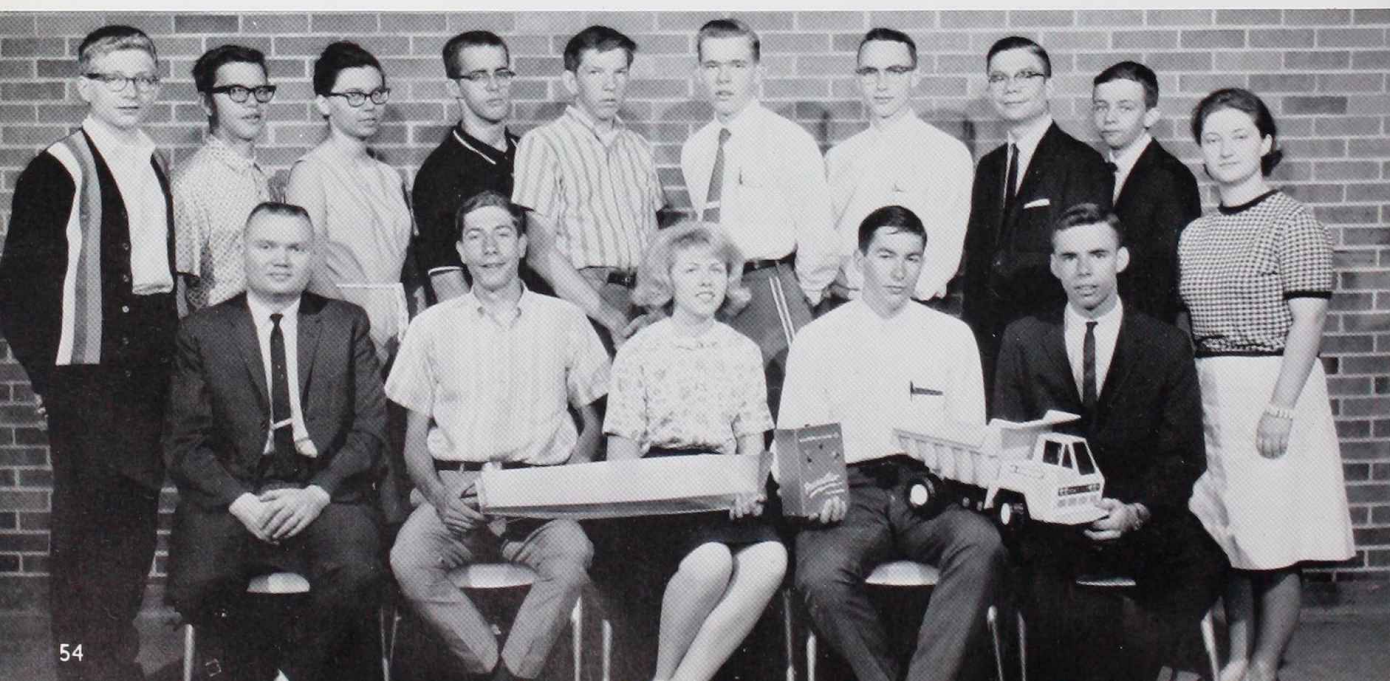

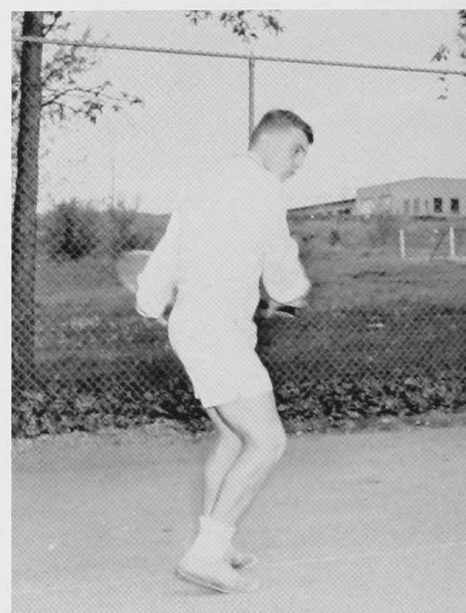
