Paul Dodge Award

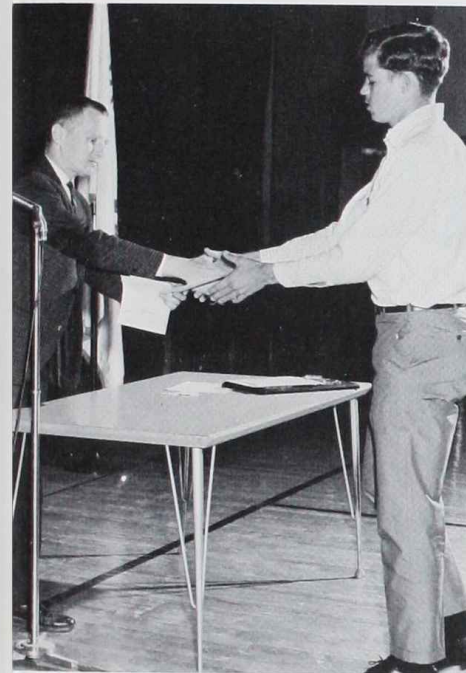

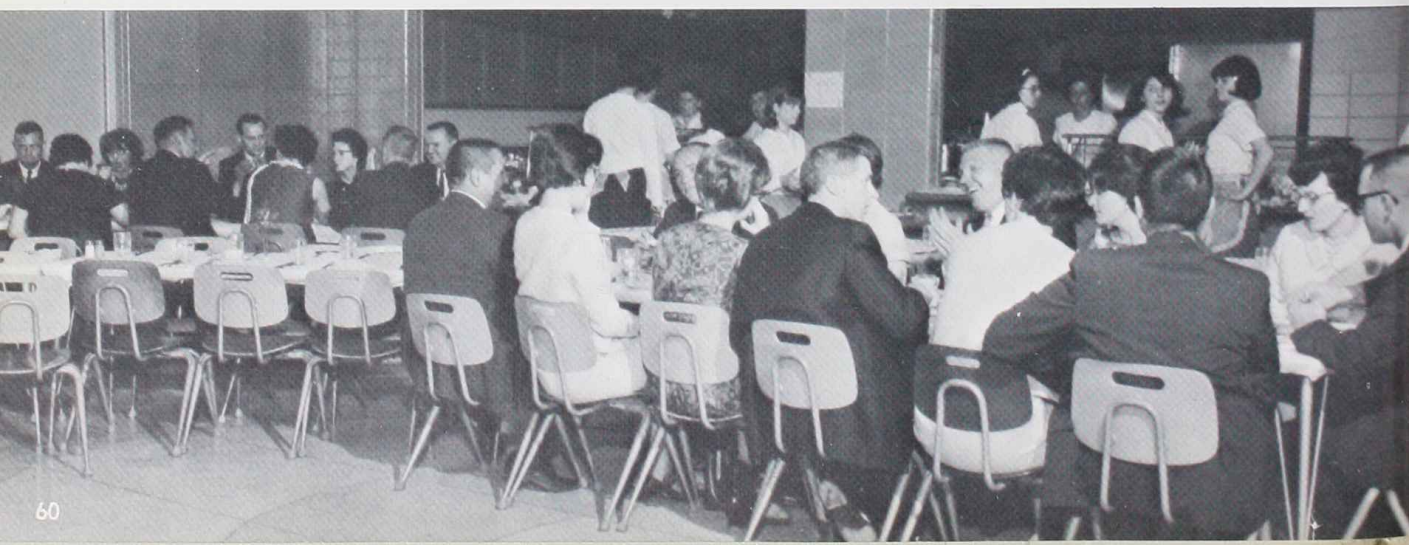




The Junior-Senior Banquet was held in the High School cafeteria this year for the first time.

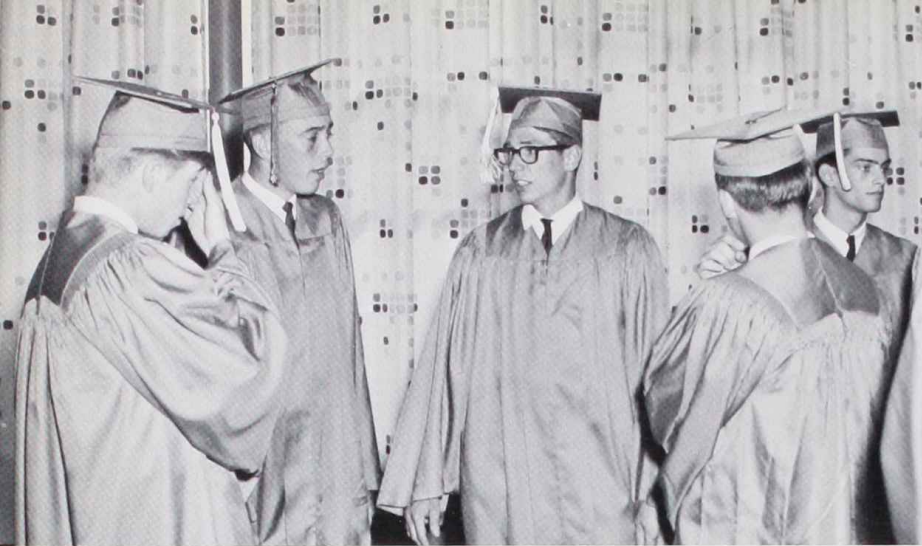
Junior-Senior Prom

The central attraction of the Prom was the sparkling fountain.



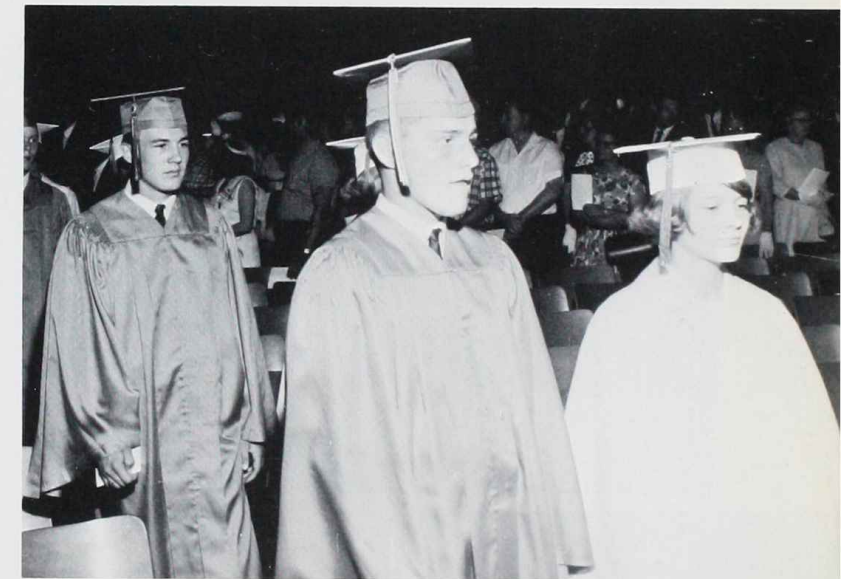
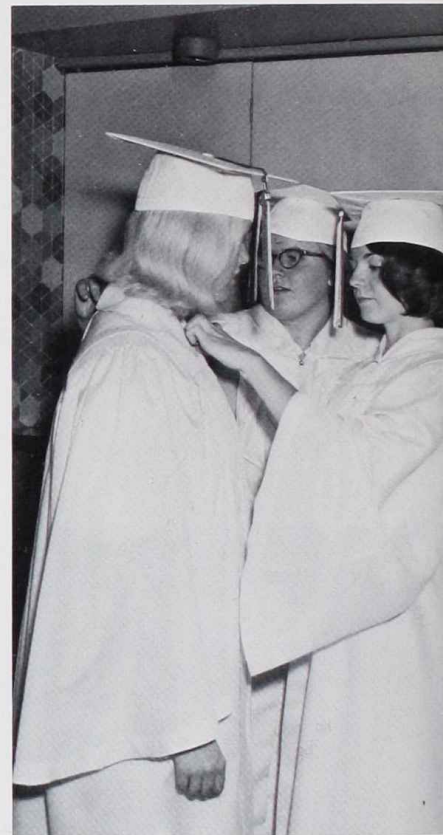

The major Junior class project this year was the snack bar. With the funds made from the snack bar, the Juniors sponsored the Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom.

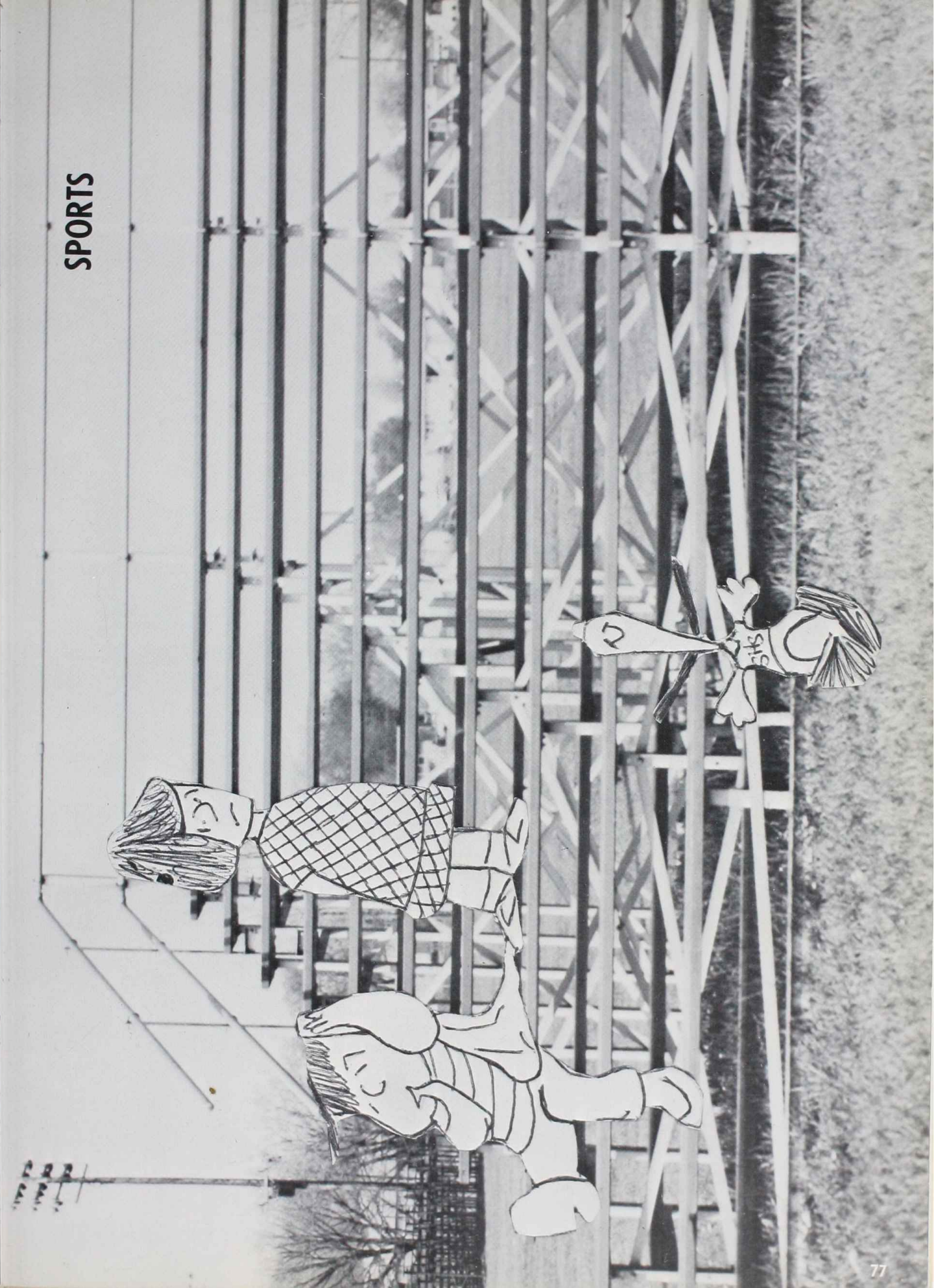

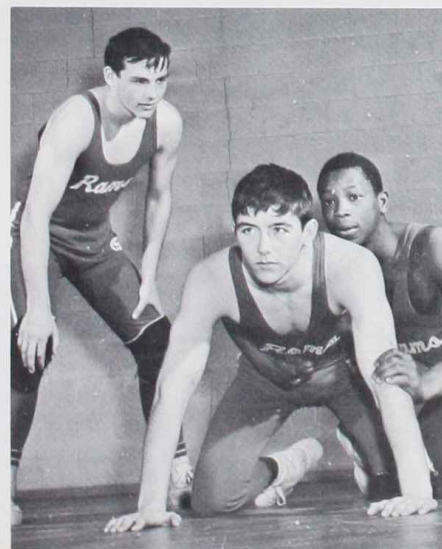
A Game, A Mood, An Impact

Very often in the language of the sports writer, to refer to the "spirited young team" that showed "lots of get-up-and-go" and "plenty of promise" is just another way of saying that here was a team that didn't fare so well in the record books. However, at Springfield this year, the cliché didn't fit.

While no scorching records were set, the school's nine teams presented an overall 47 won, 39 lost record—which meant that during a year of coming before the public sports' eye, SHS had to come out on the plus side. What's more, these *were* spirited, young teams that showed an abundance of promise!

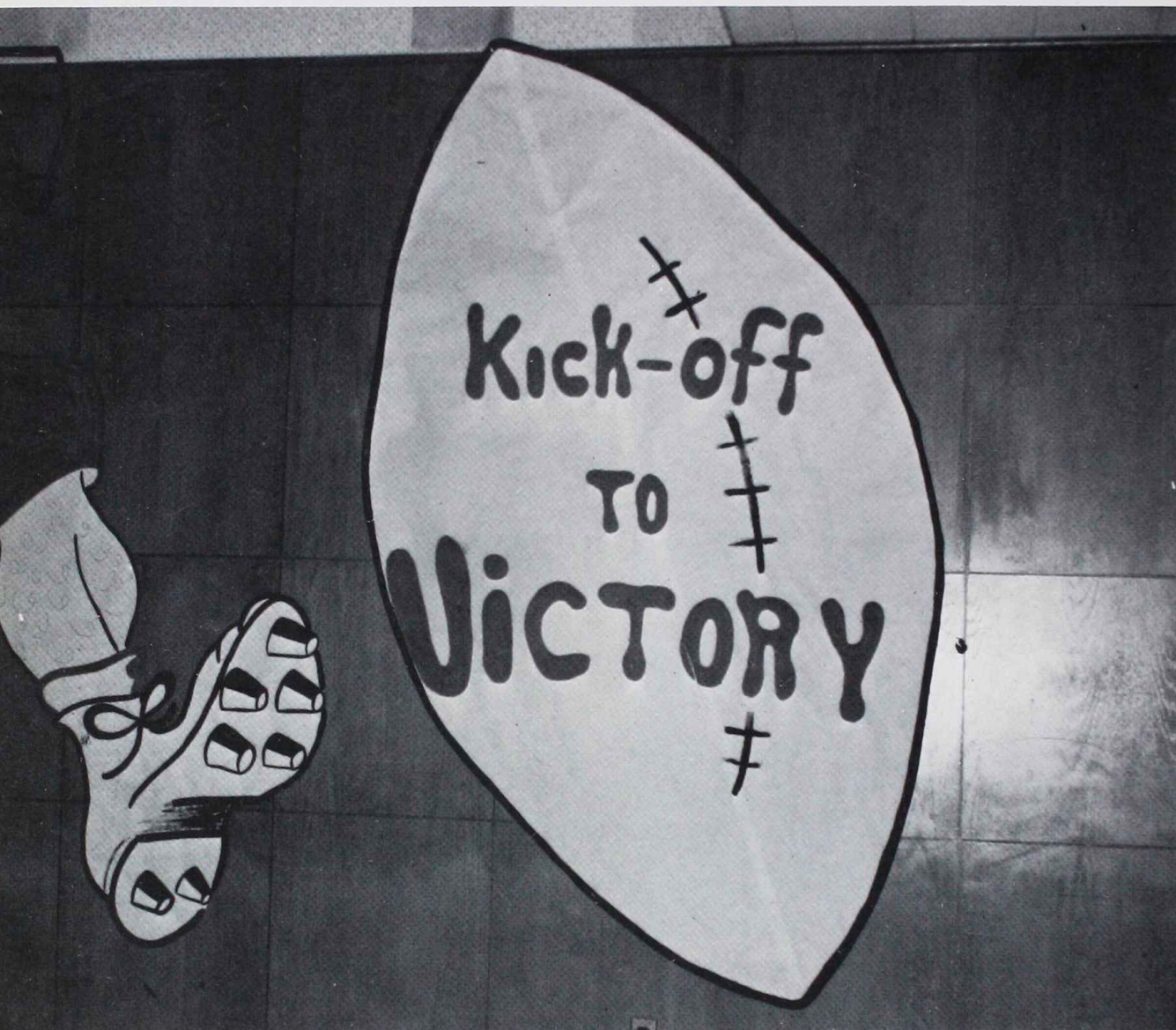
The sports' program for any year begins during the hot August football practice sessions. And before that program ends in the following spring—officially for everything but baseball—so much of the school's extra-curricular activity is affected by athletics, that to

imagine school life without sports is quite impossible. Keeping scholastically eligible, for instance, is something that concerns every athlete, just as does the problem of doing homework after a hard night of practice ...



... But even before kick-off time of any football game or before the sounds of buzzers and starting guns, there is a phenomenon known as *SPIRIT* that precedes any contest. Whether it's a bonfire on a foggy October night or a pep assembly in the dead of winter; whether it's a rash of poster-making in the cafeteria or a parade through the halls or simply the nervousness of waiting for sixth hour to end—that something called *SPIRIT* makes its impact felt.
