


### SUMMARY



The Rams got as high as fourth in the ratings before the big game with number one rated Galesburg. This was one of the big games in the state and the biggest game in the history of the school. There were an estimated six thousand fans at the game as Springfield absorbed their only defeat of the year 12-0. Under the brilliant leadership of Coach Dick Stephens the Rams had one of the finest teams in the area, and one of the finest in the school's history.

Jeff Bauer came in for a very special honor this year, as he was chosen to the all state team at his end position this year. Jeff won this honor by playing hard nosed football, making several fine receptions and one of the main reasons for Springfield's stout defense.








