ABOVE: Here it is! The winning float of 1974-1975. The Seniors' theme is the "Sting," with their bee stinging the opposing team.

























Swinging Season for 74


The season ended with Lori Shook being named most improved, Brenda Yonkman voted as team captain, and Julie Becke was honored as most valuable.







Rams Go 8-1





Each year more and more students are participating in some sports program. It is obvious through the exceptionally good seasons of our football, baseball, tennis, and girl's track teams that we are improving each year.





There was a hushed silence on June fourth as Mr. John Ryor, the guest speaker for the graduation ceremonies of the 1975 class, began his speech.


