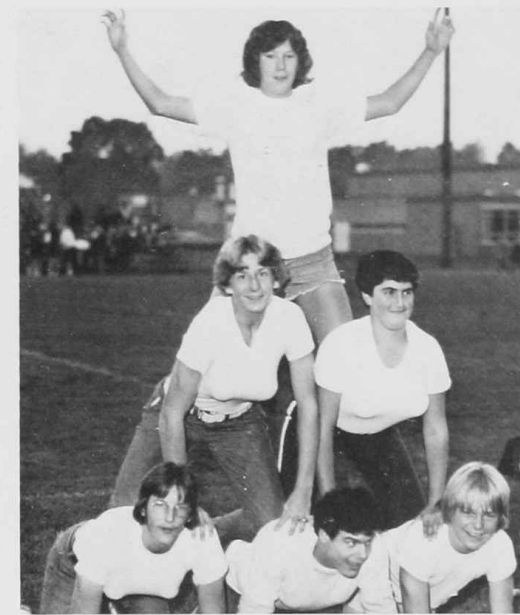

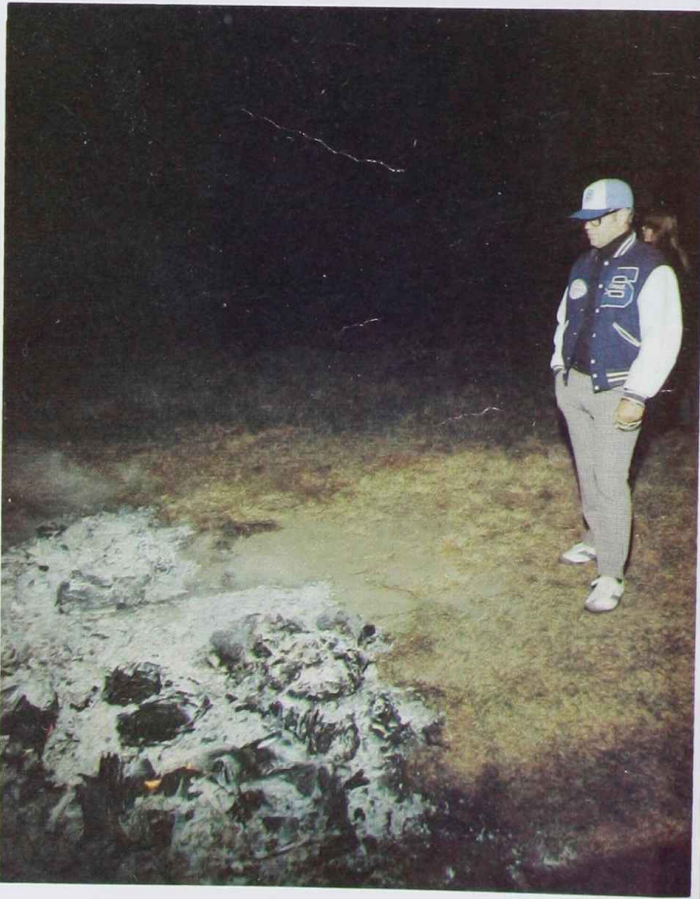

The Co-Captains of this year's team are Frank Brooks and Mike Ingle.

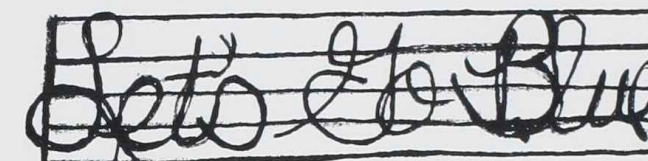
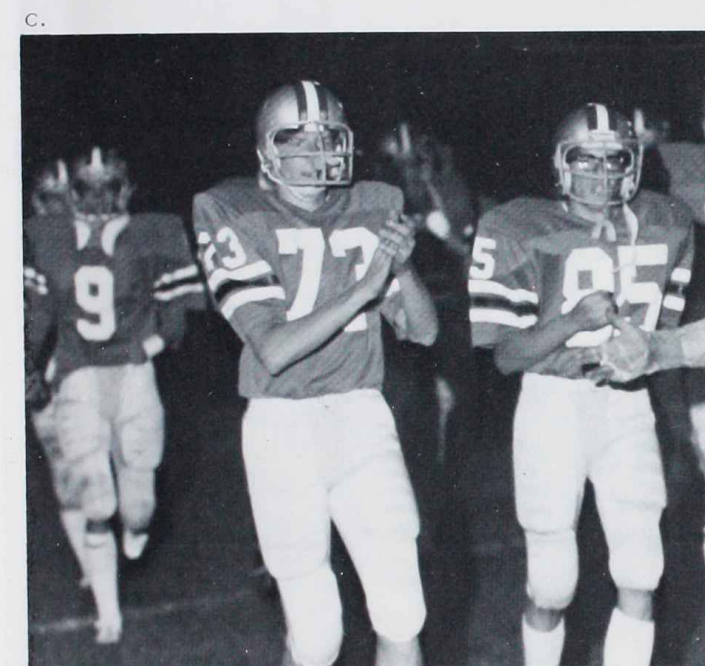
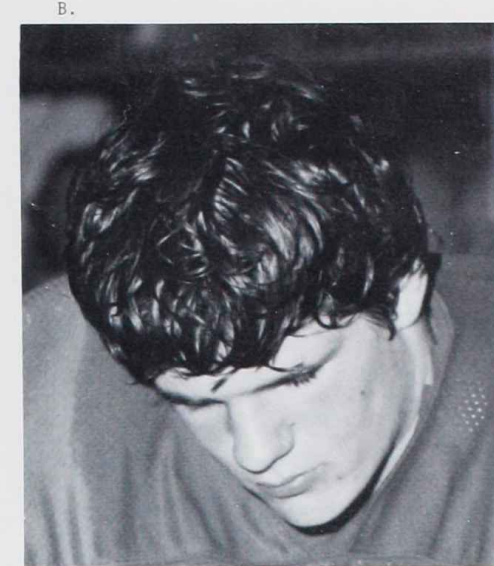

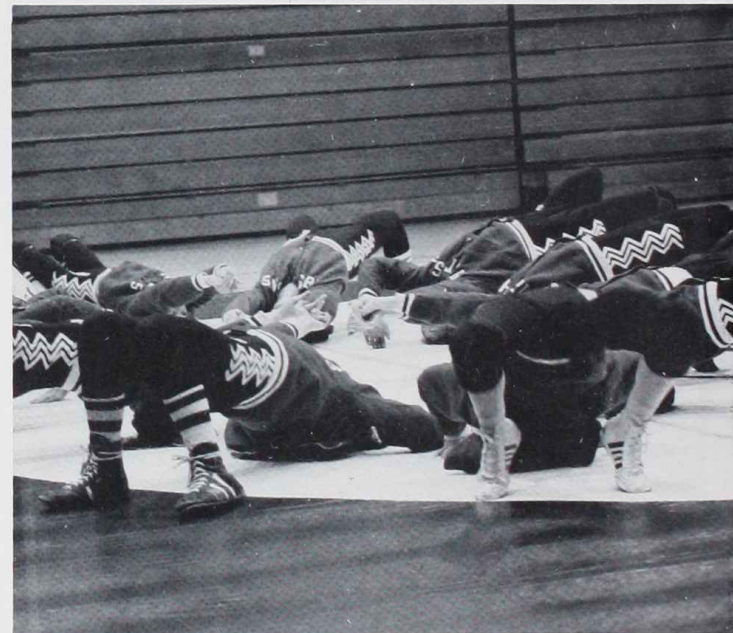

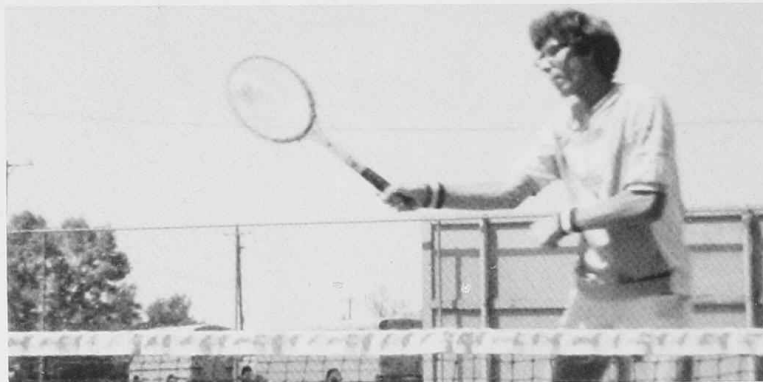
Boys Tennis Takes Third in State!
