
Spirit Week and....

It was an experience no one will ever forget.





Mrs. Whitney taught freshman English, English Literature, and creative writing here at Springfield. Mrs. Whitney also was freshman class advisor, and for sixteen years Mrs. Whitney and the freshman assumed the responsibility of raising and lowering the flag which is displayed in front of the school. She also was cheerleading advisor, guest speaker at the 1977 Junior-Senior Banquet, and author-director of the Christmas plays presented by the teachers for the student body.

Her membership in professional organizations include the Springfield Education Association, the Michigan Education Association, the National Education Association, and the National Council of English Teachers. Mrs. Whitney also wrote a book, The Springfield Story, when the city was celebrating its 25th year. It tells the history of Springfield and it was sponsored by Springfield Lions Club and Springfield Schools.

We miss Mrs. Whitney's smile, her expertise in teaching English, and, most of all, her understanding nature. We hope she enjoys this well-deserved leisure time to pursue her many interests.


