We give our deepest sympathy to her family and friends. We will all miss her, but we will never forget her.



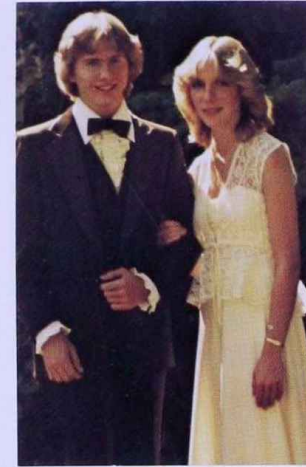

Congratulations to Kim and her court, Rhonda, Lori, Lynne, Stephanie, Amy, Sonja, Emily, Robin, and Angie.



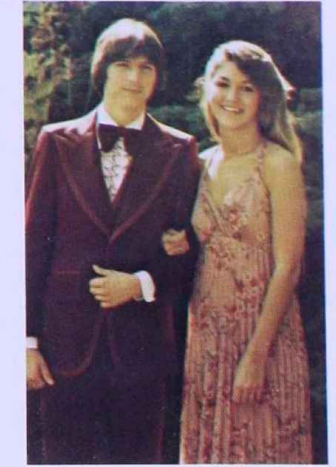

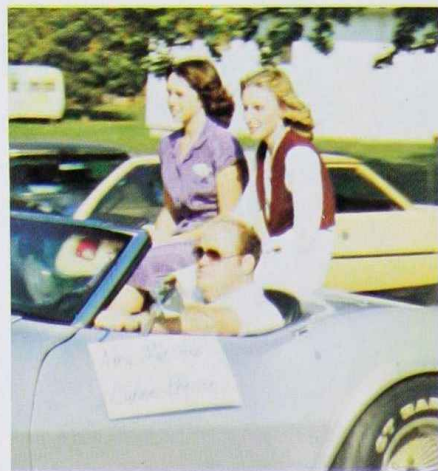

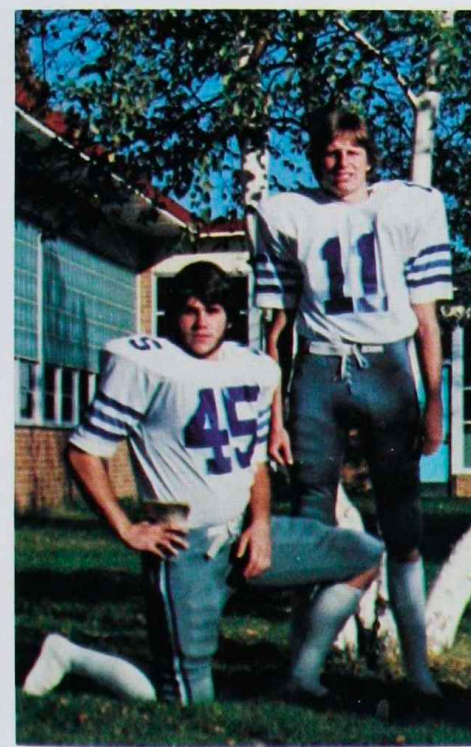

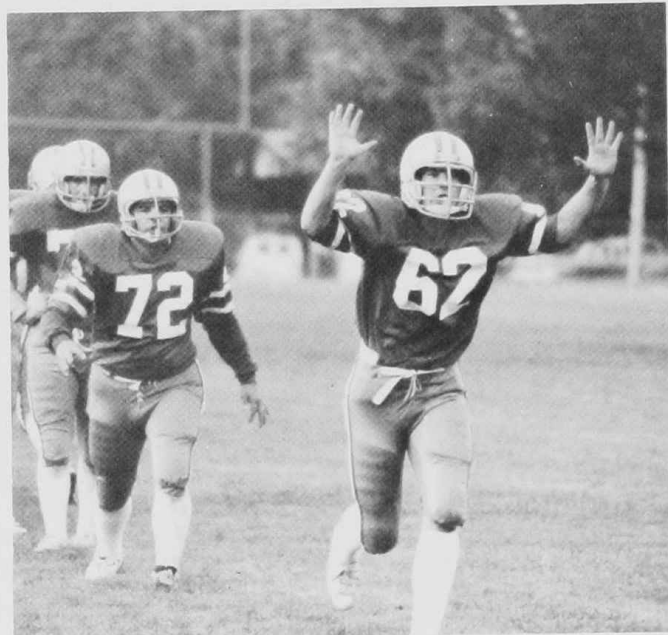

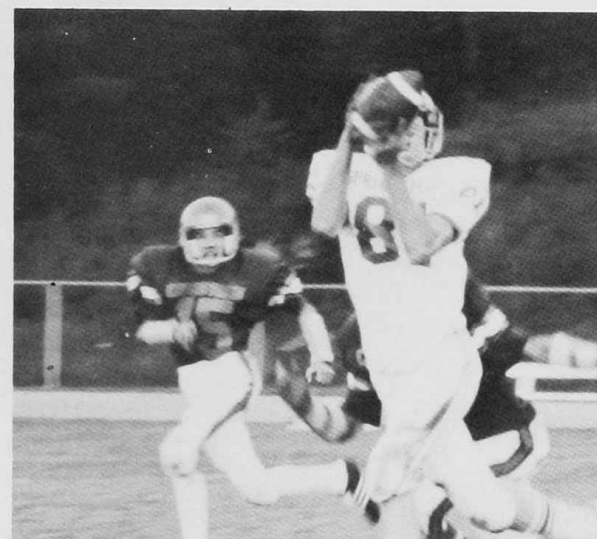

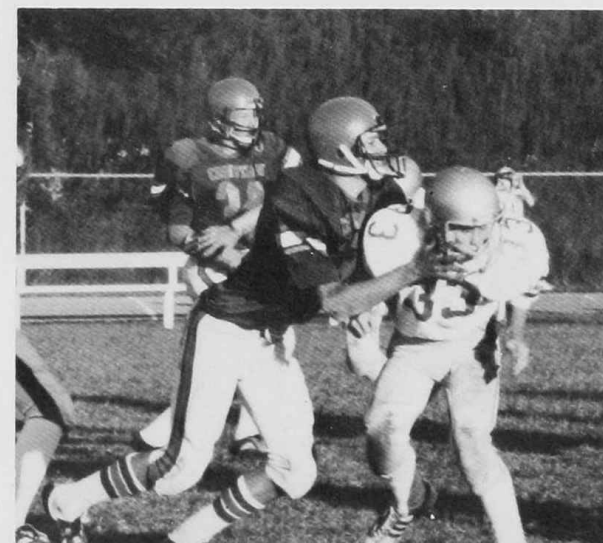

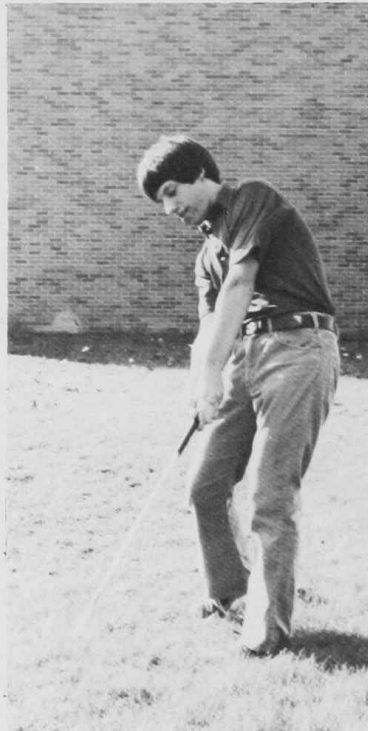

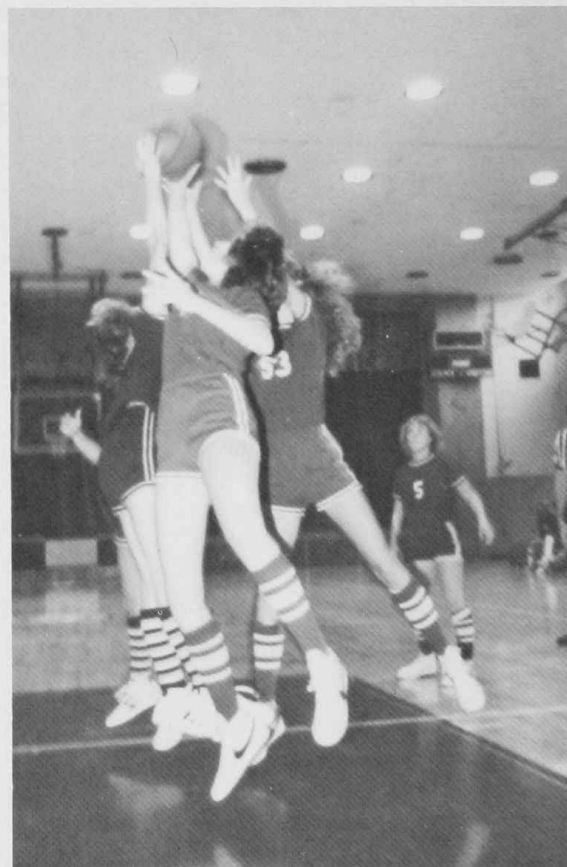

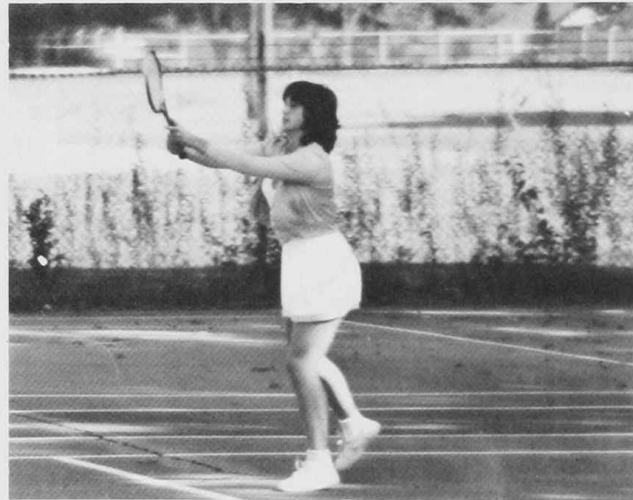

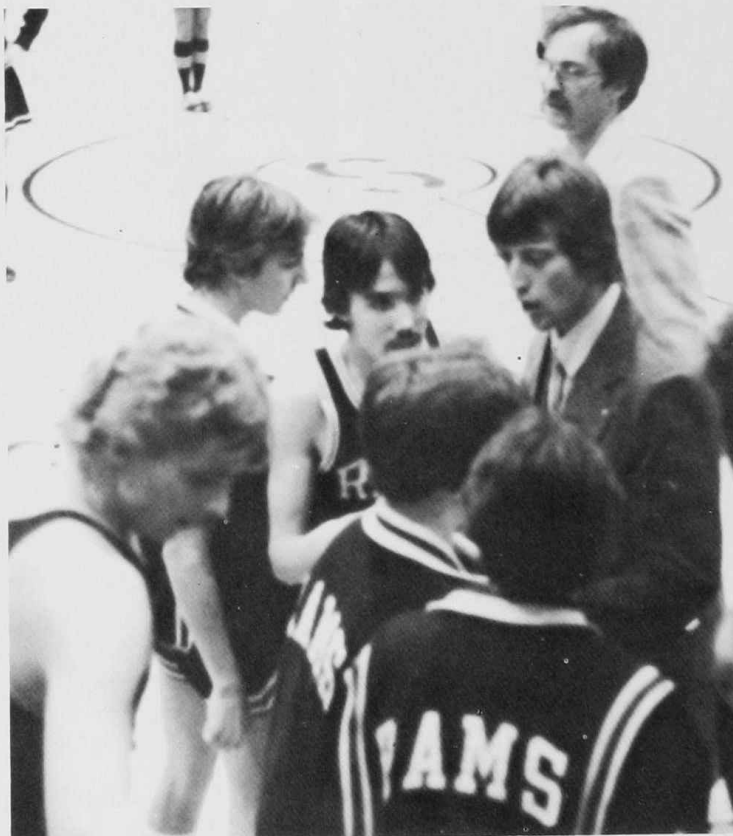

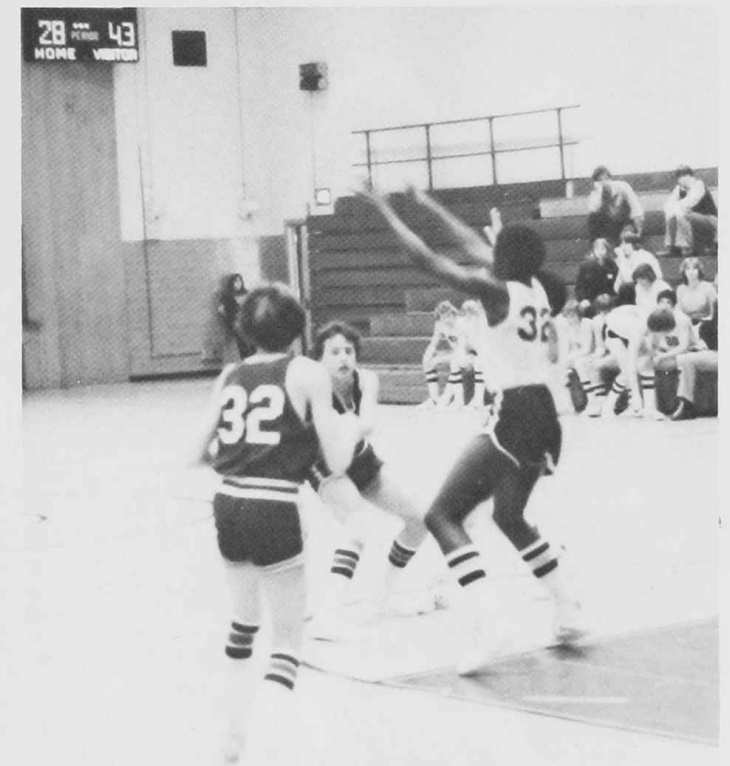

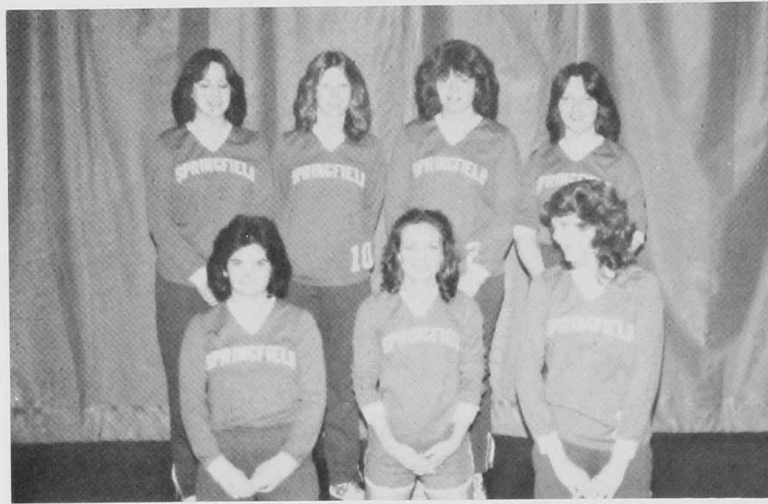

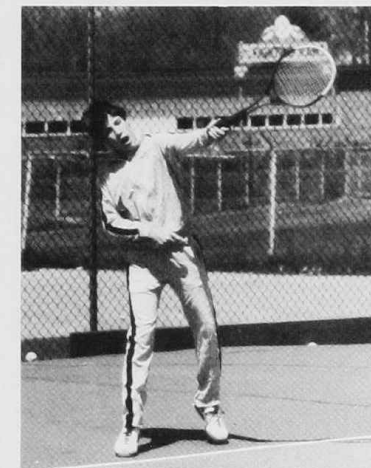

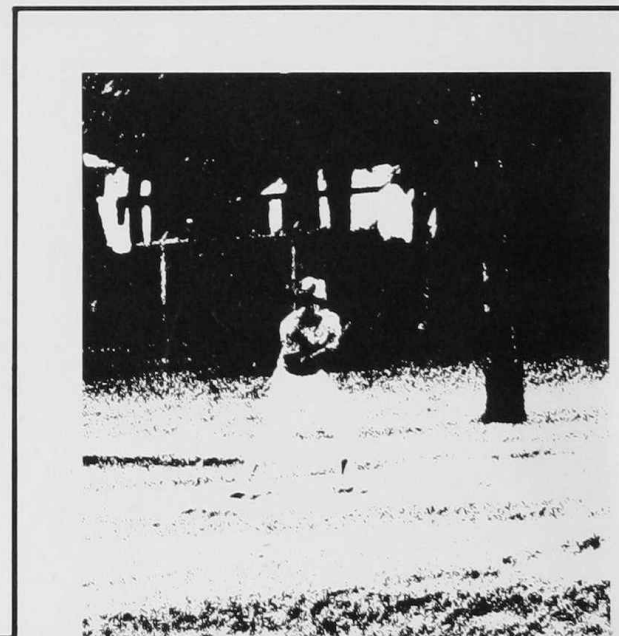

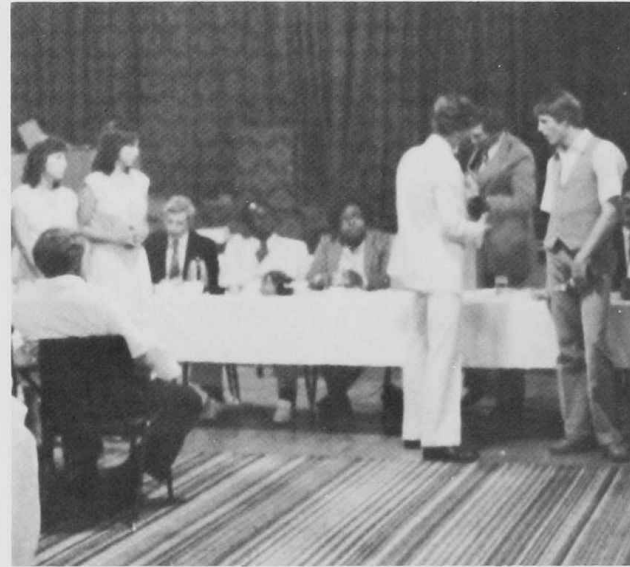
