


GOING FOR A GOOD TIME ELISABETH HOYER —A Foreign Friend With Personality







HOMECOMING ROYALTY **REIGNS OVER FESTIVITIES**












MARTY AND LORI REIGN OV ER 1982 WINTER CARNIVAL
