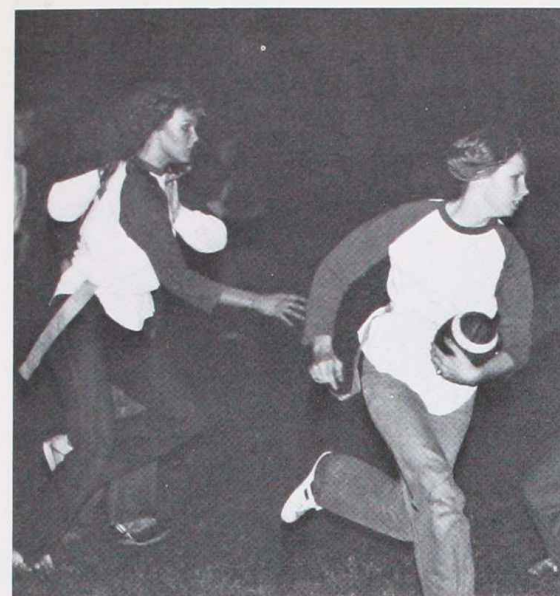
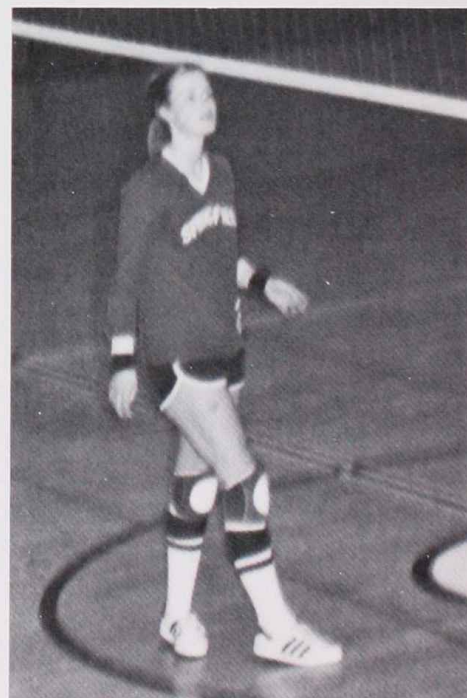
ELISABETH HOYER

Working through the Youth For Understanding program, she spent a year here in Springfield. Her host family was Mr. and Mrs. Harold Fisher.

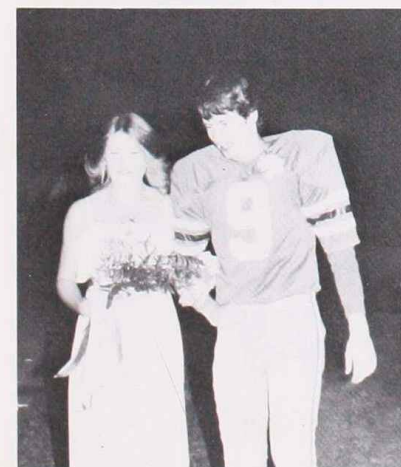

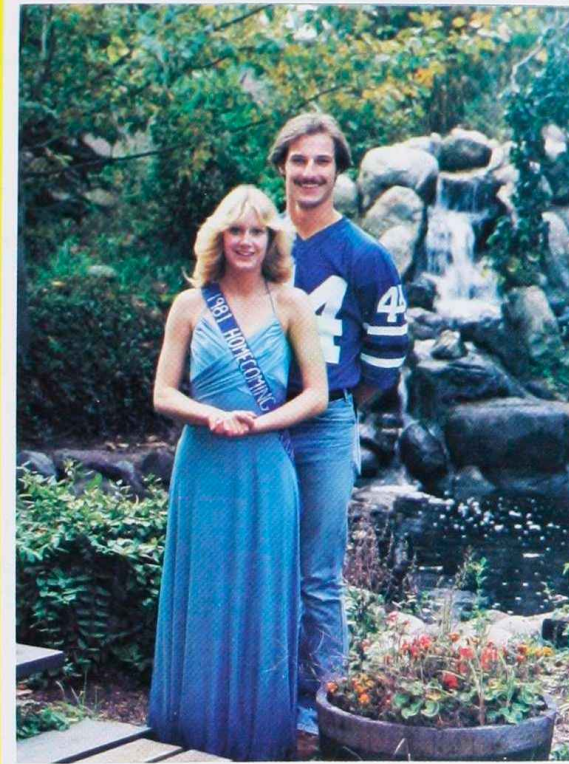

HOMECOMING ROYALTY REIGNS OVER FESTIVITIES

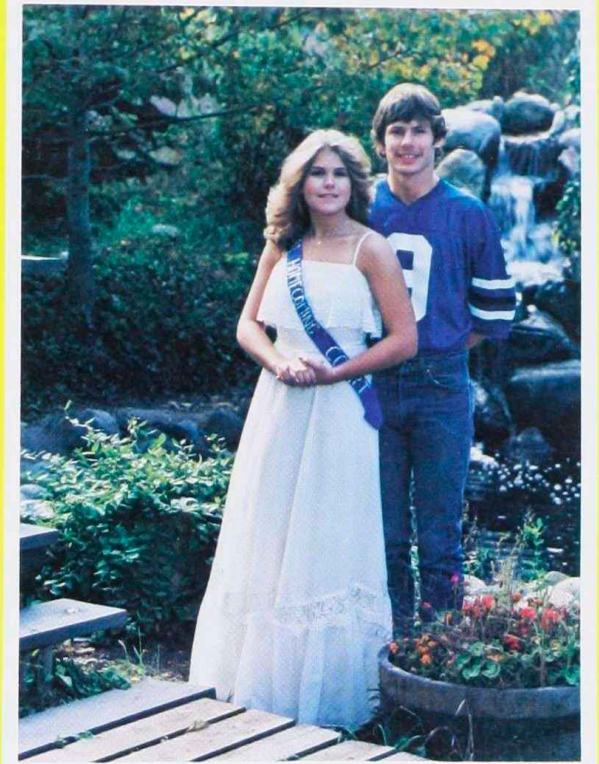

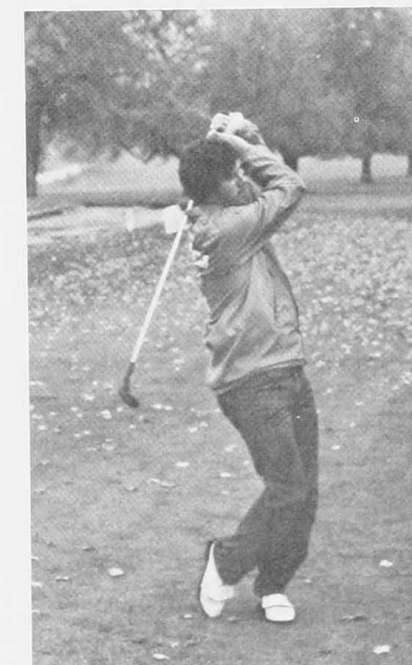

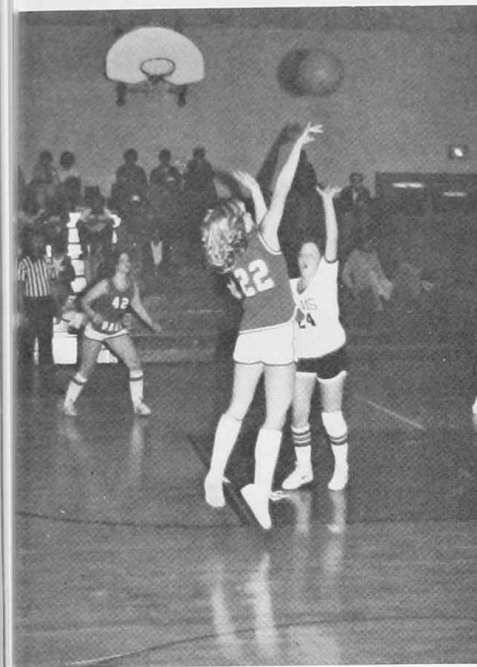
Matt Peterson (left) displays his follow through. Hal Wolf (right) had a season average of 41.2, and was chosen All-KVA.
