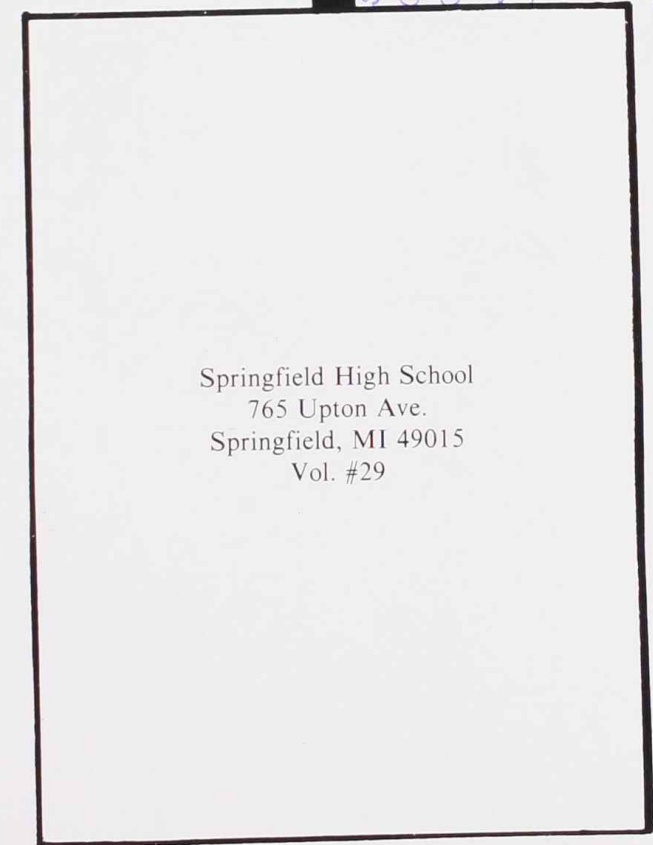

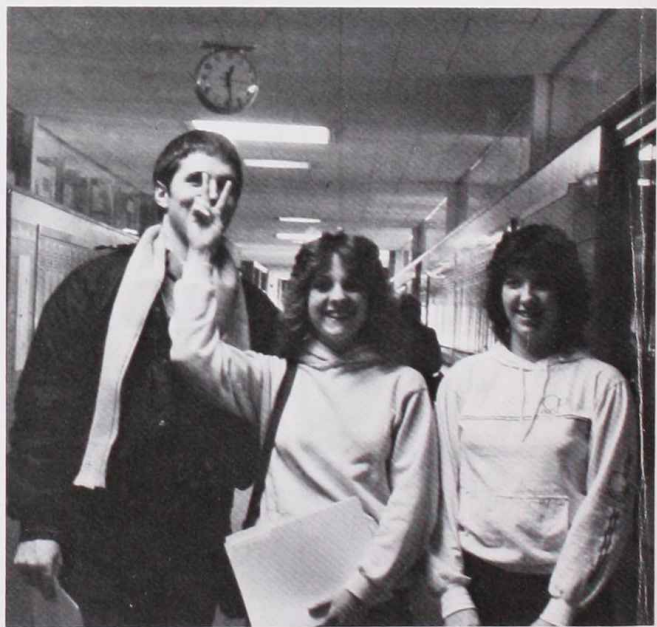

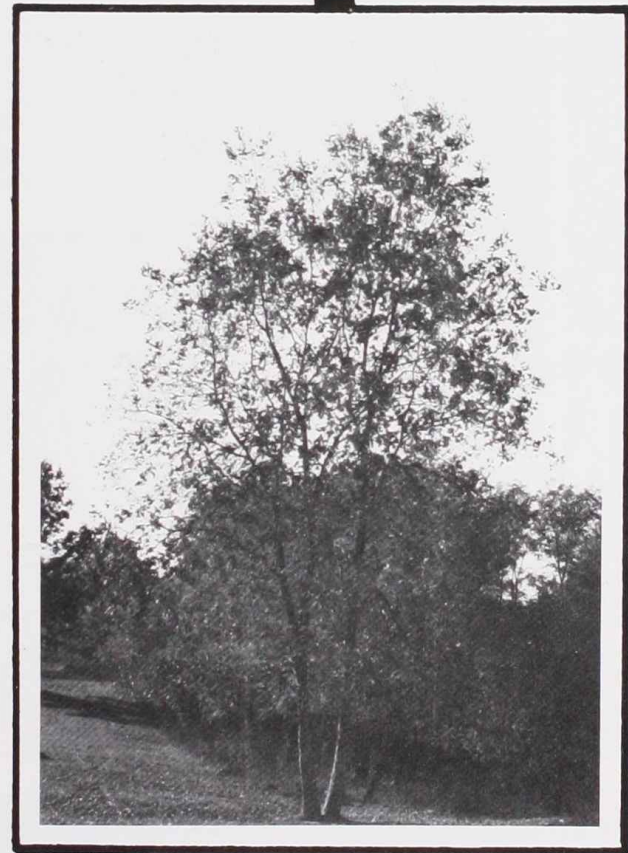

Lori Attains Crown

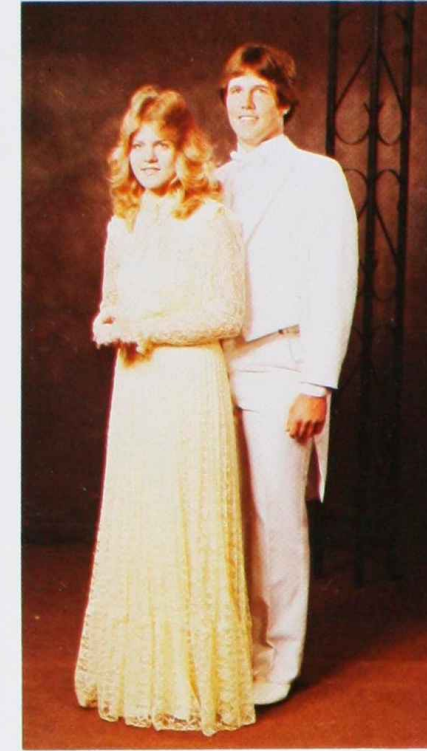

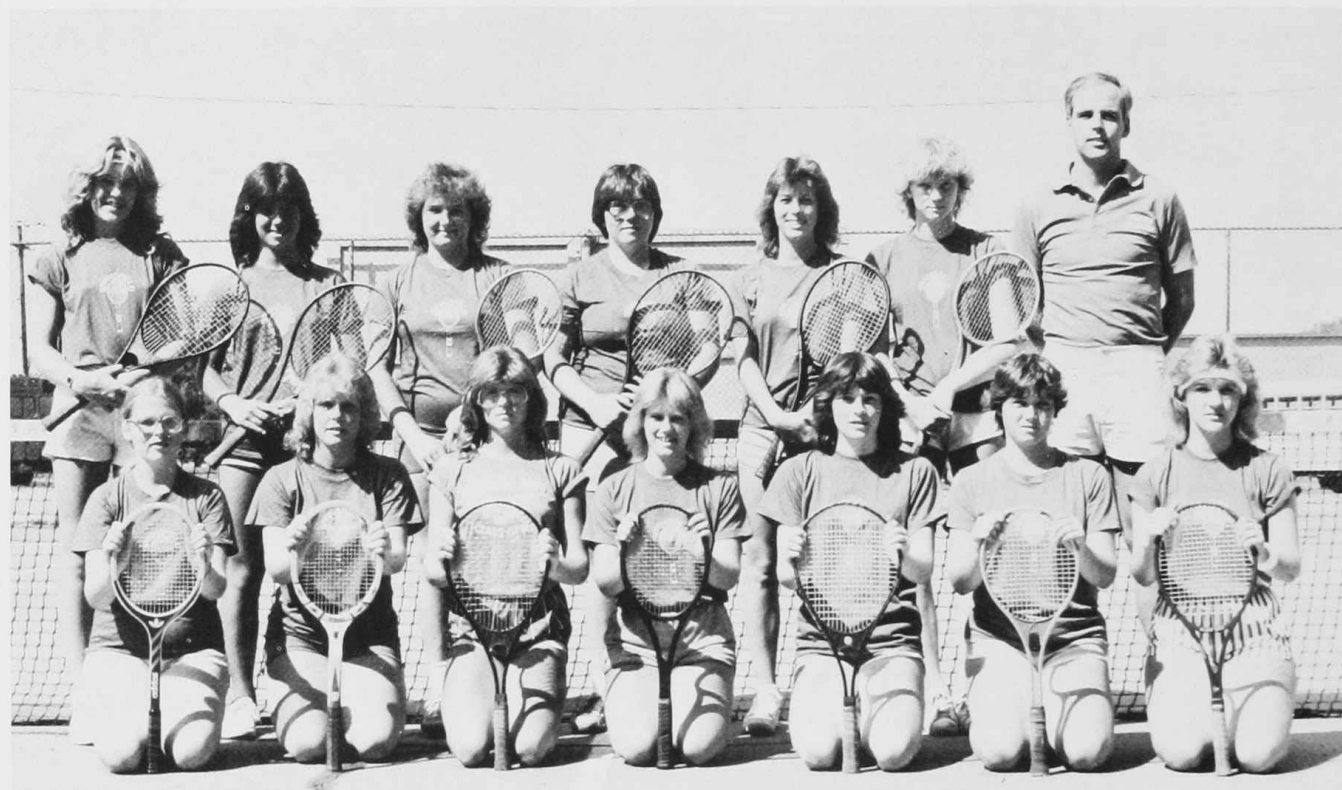

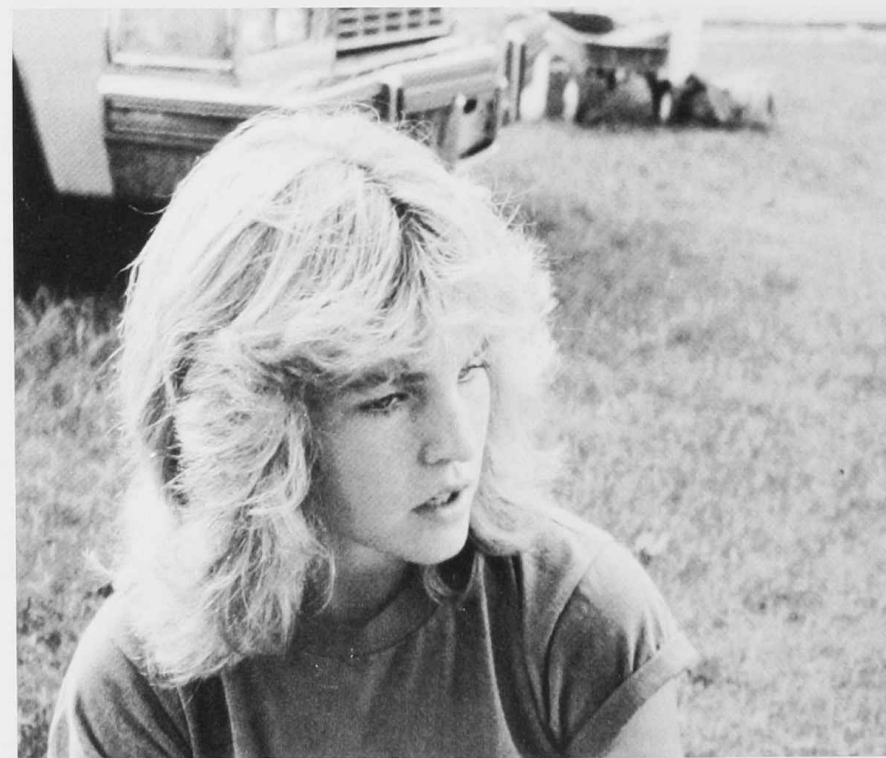

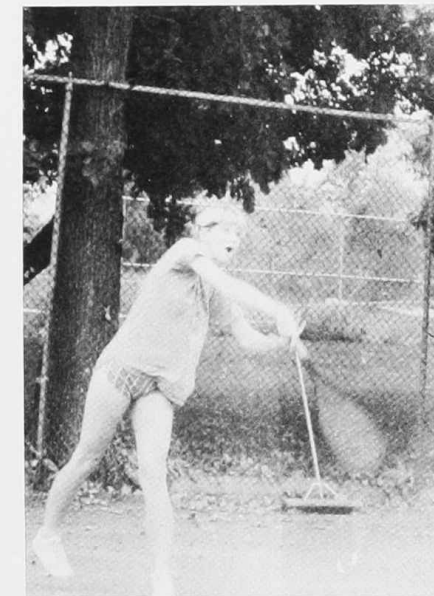

Our team was coached by Don Christensen. The team consisted of eleven members. Jim Smith was golf medalist with a 45.8 average.

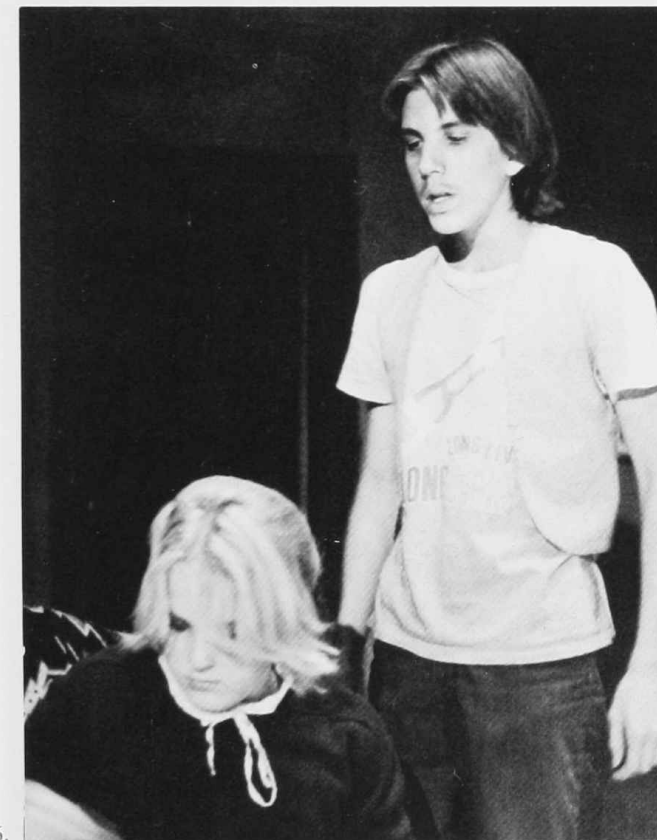

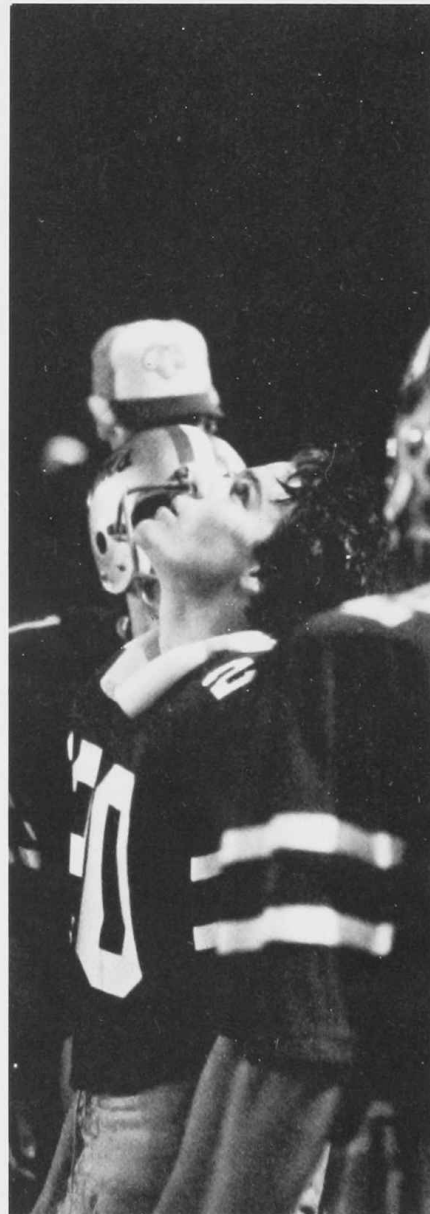

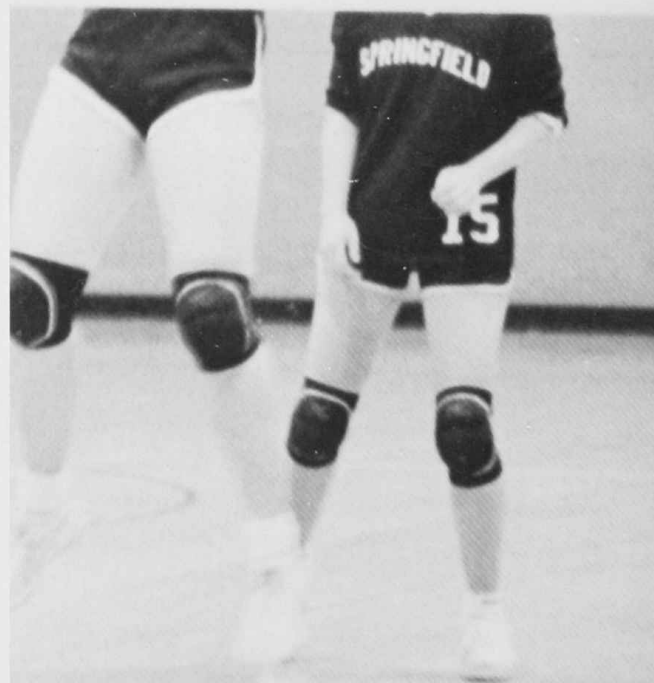
Varsity Volleyball Finishes Third in SMAA

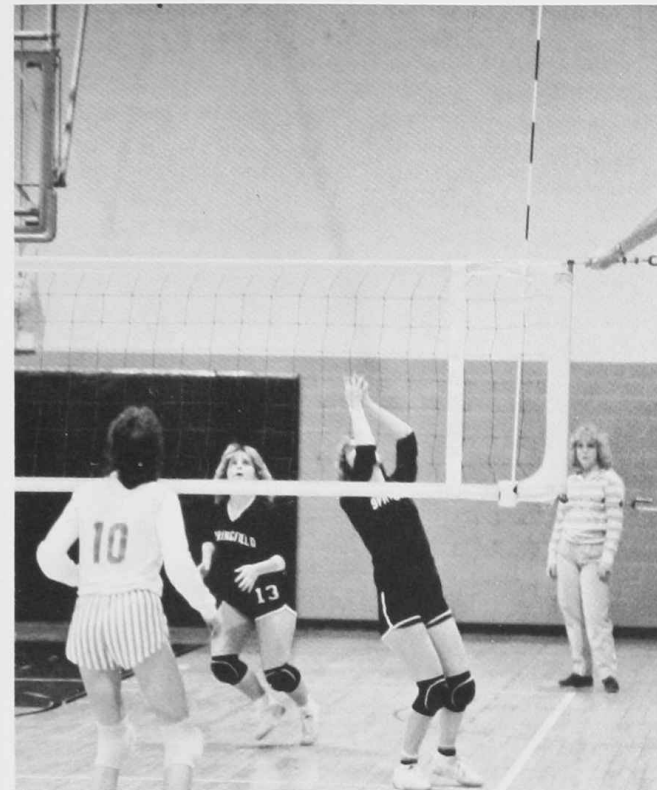

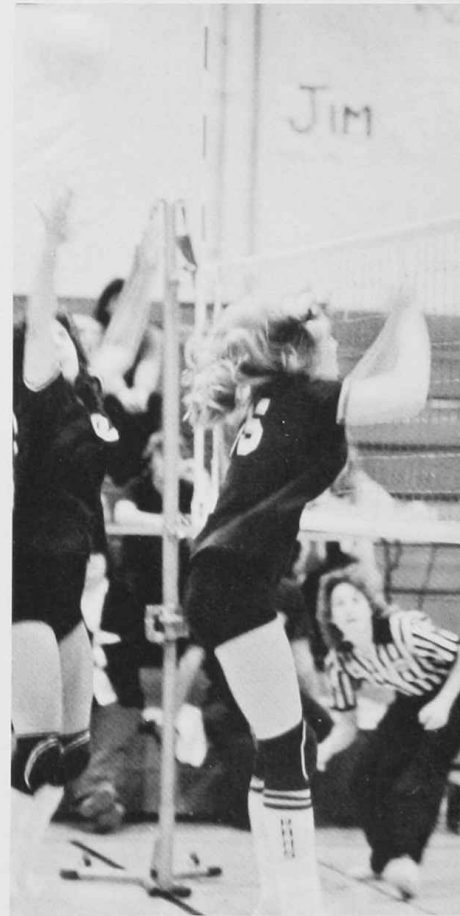

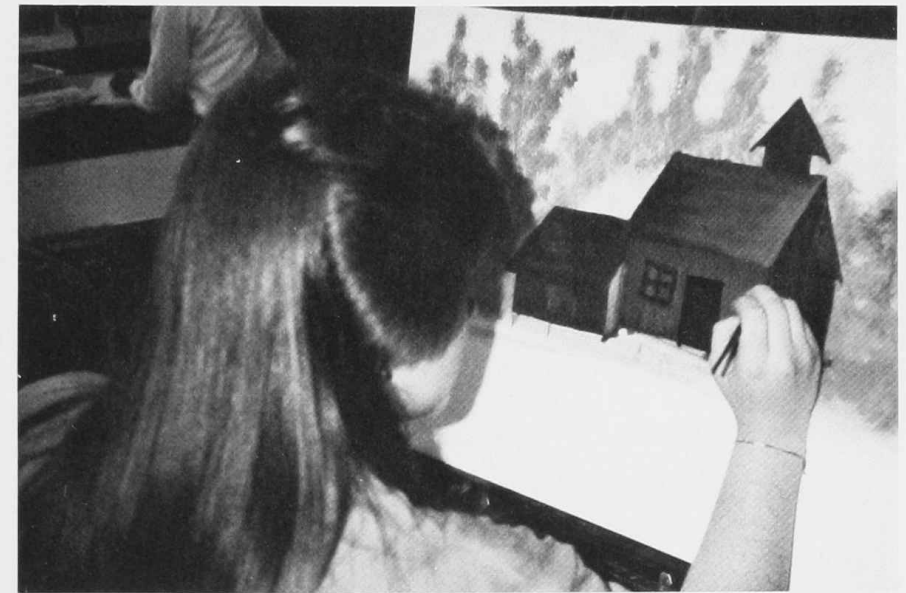

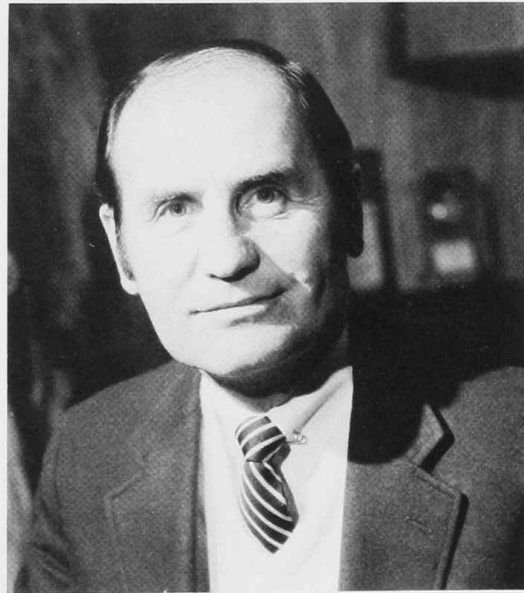
Yearbook Newspaper
