

17th Fall Play Draws Crowd












The play was put on the 15th and the 16th of November at the Springfield Middle School. About 150 people attended the play.



















The 36 members of cast and crew practiced very hard for eight weeks before the play went on May 3rd and 4th at the Springfield Middle School. About 100 people attended the performances.


