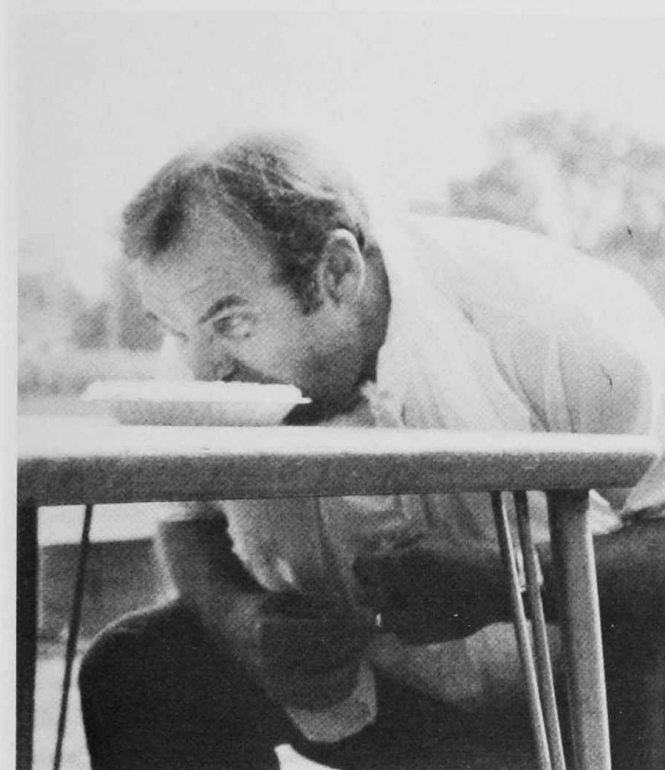
# A WEEK TO REMEMBER

## Top Achievers

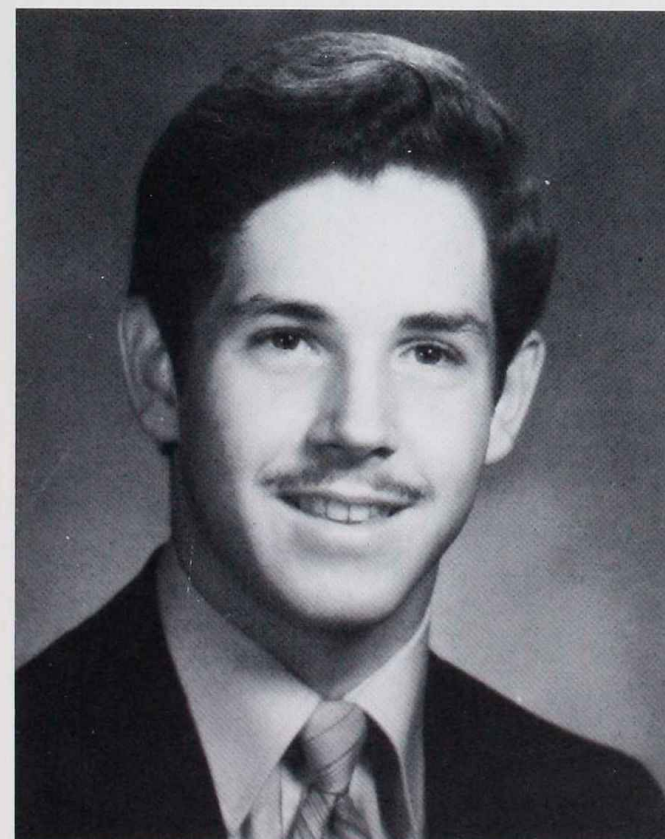
