Victoria Mangosing gave the Valedictorian Address. She conveyed that the now graduated seniors were like birds leaving their nests and soaring on to new heights.

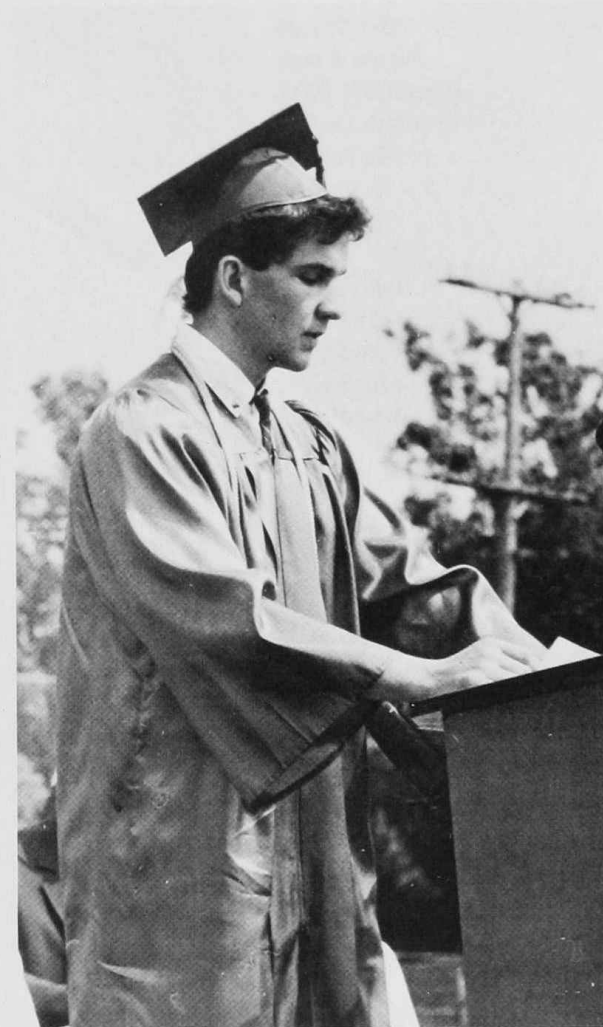
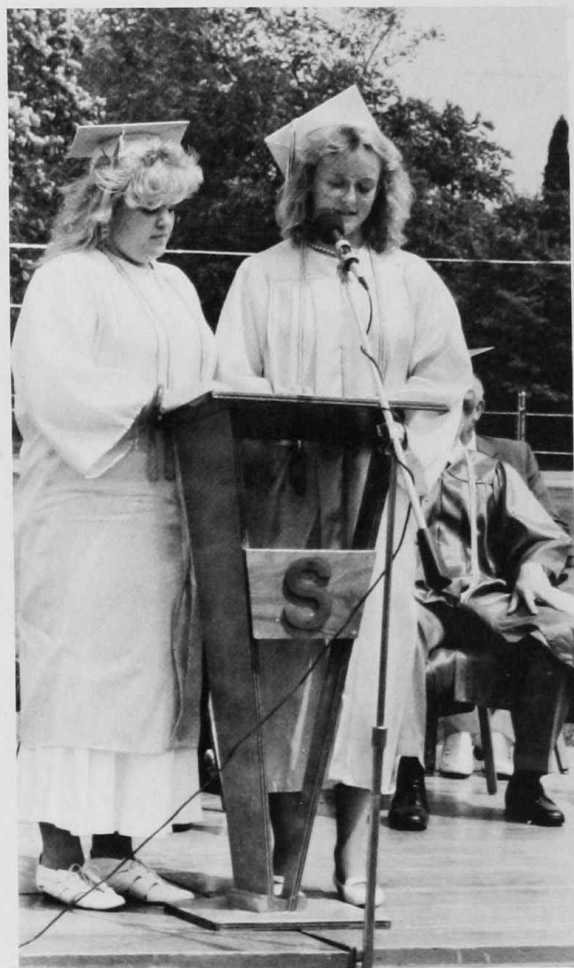

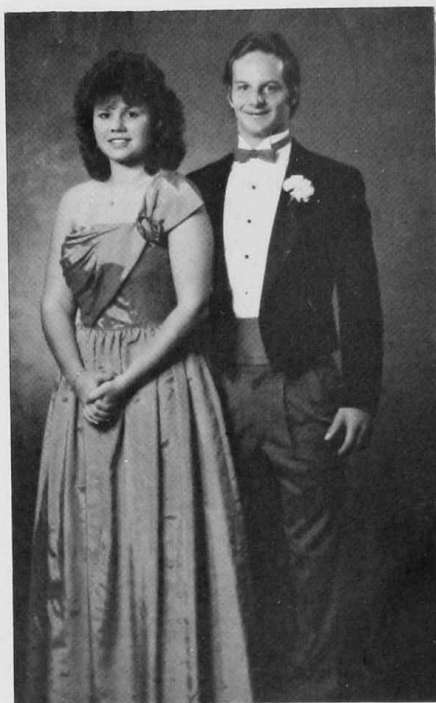

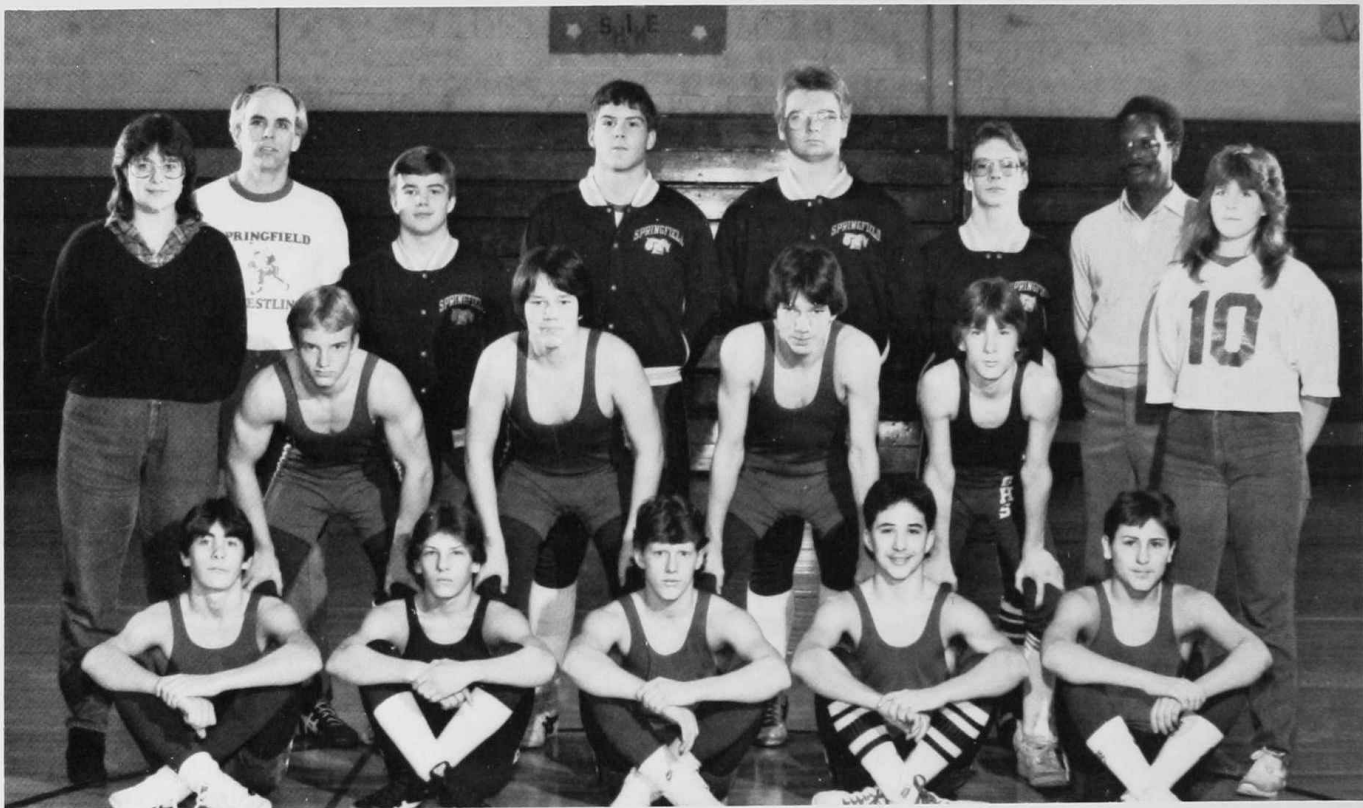

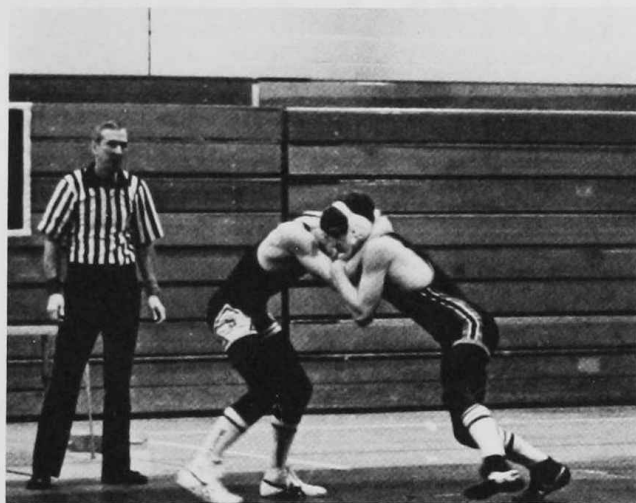

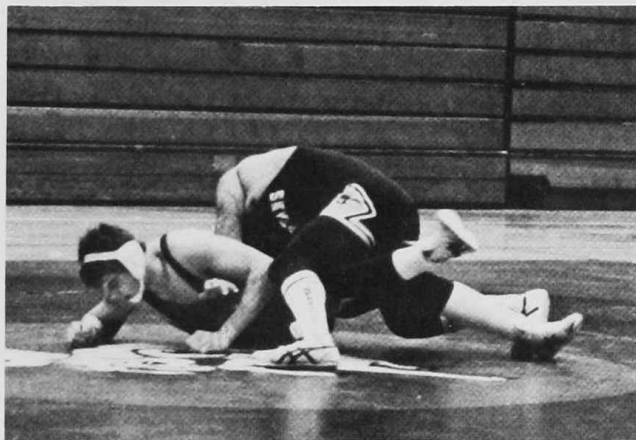

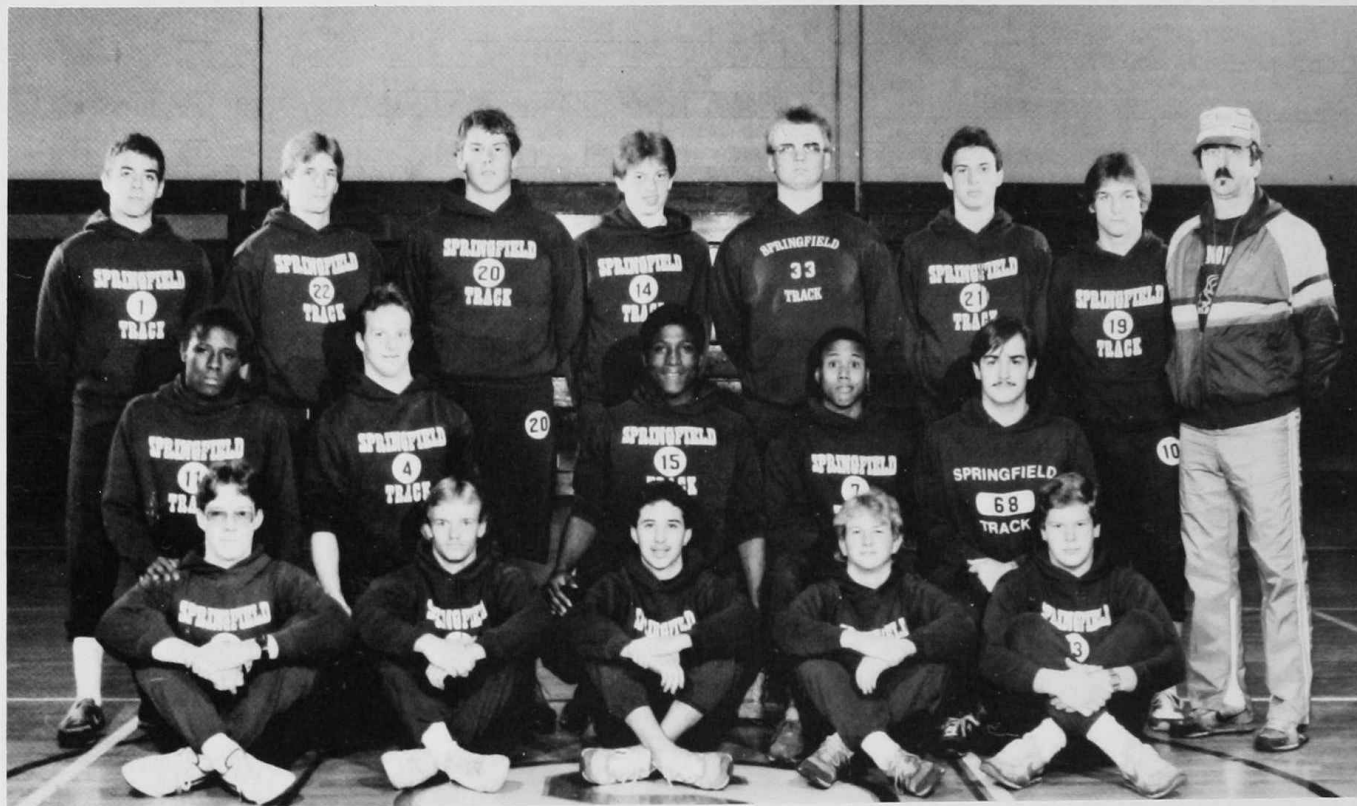

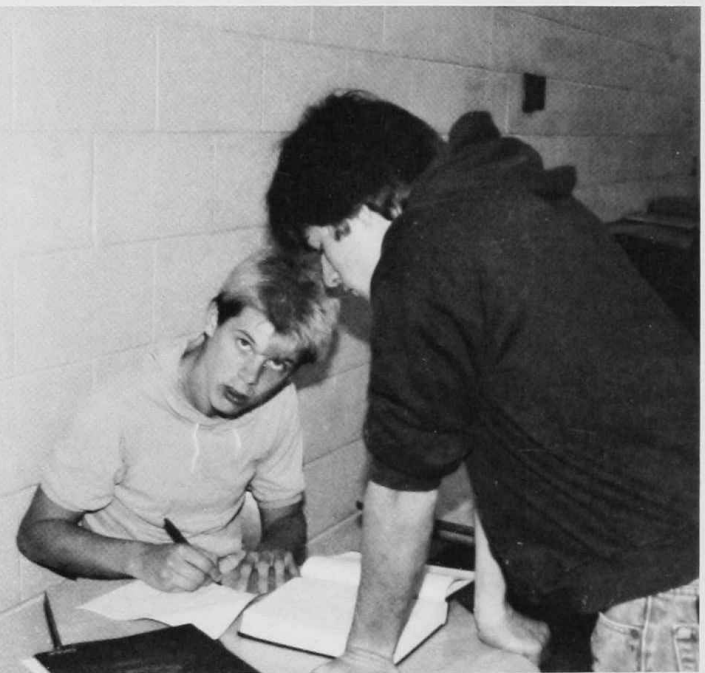
